The calendar Committee has provided the following notes which explain the rationale for the calendar. Karl Peterson as Chair of the Calendar Committee and a Faculty Senator will be available to answer any question and explain the calendar.

Notes related to the proposed 2012-13 Academic Calendar:

- 39-week faculty contract period from Monday, August 27, 2012 through Sunday, May 26, 2013.
- Fall 2012 semester
 - Academic Day on Tuesday, September 4, 2012
 - o Classes begin on Wednesday, September 5, 2012
 - First week of classes (W-F) and Thanksgiving week (M-Tu) make a full week of classes.
 - o Fourteen weeks of classes, with fourteen meetings for each day of the week.
 - o Commencement on Saturday, December 15, 2012.
- J-term officially begins on Saturday, December 22, 2012. This allows for the maximum time and flexibility in schedule J-term courses. Most J-term offerings will begin on Wednesday, January 2, 2013 or Monday, January 7, 2012.
- Spring 2013 semester
 - o Classes begin on Monday, January 28, 2013.
 - Spring break has been pushed back one week compared to normal.
 - First weekend of spring break is in session for classes that meet on the weekends. Second weekend is the "break" weekend.
 - Commencement on Saturday, May 18, 2013.
- Summer Session
 - SS1 officially begins on Tuesday, May 28, 2013 due to Monday, May 27, 2013 being a University Holiday.

^{*} Note: Saturday classes will have a final exam on Saturday, May 11, 2013.

Notable changes

- Finals weeks are only four days. One exam slot in the old finals schedule was dedicated to the capstone courses. This one slot caused finals to spill over onto the Friday of finals week. The loss of the capstone courses has removed the need for that special exam session and, thereby, the need for a fifth day of finals.
- Spring Break has been pushed back one week compared to normal for Spring 2013. We will have eight weeks of class, Spring Break, and then six weeks of class followed by finals.
- Notes related to the final exam sessions for Saturday classes have been added for the first time. The dates proposed are consistent with current practice for these courses.
- All holidays are referred to as "University Holidays", rather than specifying some and not specifying others.
