Listed below are Fond du Lac Tribal & Comm College (FDL) courses most directly applicable to the UW-River Falls Gen Ed requirements. This is intended as a guide for program planning and is subject to revision if Gen Ed requirements or course evaluations change. Students may also check for updates to the Gen Ed and program requirements in the UW-RF catalog at: www.uwrf.edu/catalog.

I. GENERAL EDUCATION

- A. Communication – Reading and Writing (CW):** ENGL 1001
- B. Communication – Advanced (CA):** ENGL 1020 or 1030 or 1040
- C. Communication – Speaking and Listening (CS):** SPCH 1010 (Bus or Mktg Com majors may take BUS 1055)
- D. Humanities and Fine Arts (HF): Select one course from two different areas.**
 - 1. Art: ART 1001 (Required for Elementary Education majors)
 - 2. Film: ENGL 2030
 - 3. Literature: ENGL 1010 (Literature is required for teacher ed students)
 - 4. Music: MUSC 1010, 1030, 1040 (A MUSC course is required for Elementary Education students)
 - 5. Philosophy: PHIL 1020, 2001, 2010
 - 6. Theatre: THTR 1001 (Required for English Education majors)
- E. Social and Behavioral Sciences (SB): Select one course from 2 different areas:**
 - 1. Anthropology: ANTH 1020
 - 2. Geography (Human/Cultural): GEOG 1020, 1040 (Also meets a non-western history/culture requirement for teacher education students)
 - 3. History: HIST 1010, 1011, 1030, 1031 (Also meets a western history/culture requirement for teacher ed students)
 - 4. Political Science: POLS 1010, 1030 (POLS 1010 required for Social Work majors)
 - 5. Psychology: PSYC 2001 (Required for Social Work majors)
 - 6. Sociology: SOC 1001 (Required for Sociology and Social Work students)
- F. Sciences (S) and Sciences with Lab (SL): Select one course from two of the following areas, at least one with lab.** Students majoring in sciences, agricultural or environmental sciences areas may need more supporting sciences. All teacher education students need a biology course. Consult UW-RF catalog or academic departments.
 - 1. Biology: BIOL 1010, 1101 (BIOL 1101 required for phy. ed., social work, most science, agric sci majors)
 - 2. Chemistry: CHEM 1001, 1010 (CHEM 1010 required for most science majors and all agricultural sci majors)
 - 3. Geography: GEOG 1010
 - 4. Geology/Earth Science: GEOL 1001 (Required for Geology or Conservation majors)
 - 5. Physics/Astronomy: PHYS 1001, 1002, 1020
- G. Mathematics (M):** Minimum Math requirements vary by major. Consult catalog or academic department.
 - 1. Select 1 from MATH 1010 or higher (MATH 1010 or 1015 required for all agriculture majors. MATH 1020 or 2001 required for Business or Accounting students. MATH 1050 required for Elementary Education majors.)
- H. Personal Health and Wellness (HW) and Health/Physical Activity (HA):** This includes a wellness/healthy lifestyle component (HW) and a physical activity (HA) component.
 - 1. Courses which meet the HW component only: HLTH 1010 or 2010
 - 2. Courses which meet the HA component only: Any 1 credit PE activity course (PE 1002 to 2010)
- I. Ethical Citizenship (EC):** Select one course from BIOL 1060 BUS 1080 or GEOG 1030 or JOUR 1001

Students who complete the Associate of Arts Degree are considered to have satisfied UW-RF Gen Ed, except for a junior/senior level “Multidisciplinary Inquiry” course, and any specific college, major or professional licensure requirements.

II. OTHER UNIVERSITY-WIDE REQUIREMENTS

 These courses may double count in any area of the UW-RF degree.

- A. UW System Ethnic/Cultural Diversity Requirement** (One course) This is generally taken at UW-RF, but courses such as ANTH 1001, HIST 1050, 1051, SOC 1020 would satisfy this requirement.
- B. UW-RF Global Perspectives Requirement** (One course) A course at the sophomore level or higher, which examines subject matter from a global/international perspective. This is usually taken at UW-RF.

III. MAJOR/MINOR COURSES

 Additional courses should be selected based on the intended subject area major/minor. Consult the UW-RF web site (www.uwrf.edu) for links to academic departments, program requirements and the catalog.

GPA standards and enrollment limits may be placed on specific majors if needed to stay within program capacity. Consult the UW-RF Admissions Office website for transfer admission standards. **Priority consideration** may be given to students who have completed the Communication, Math and Science requirements prior to transfer. **Transfer after one year** is recommended for teacher education, social work and agriculture majors.
