



## KISHWAUKE COLLEGE

Listed below are Kishwaukee College courses most directly applicable to UW-River Falls Gen Ed requirements. This is intended as a guide for program planning and is subject to revision if degree requirements or course evaluations change. ### I. GENERAL EDUCATION

- A. Communication – Reading and Writing (CW):** ENG 103
- B. Communication – Advanced (CA):** ENG 104
- C. Communication – Speaking and Listening (CS):** SPE 100
- D. Humanities and Fine Arts (HF): Select one course from two different areas.**
  - 1. Art: ART 282
  - 2. Literature: ENG 201, 202, 211, 212, 292, 297 (A literature course is required for all teacher education majors)
  - 3. Music: MUS 220 (Required for Elementary Education majors)
  - 4. Philosophy: PHL 101, 200
  - 5. Theatre: THE 203
  - 6. Humanities/General: HUM 119, 129
- E. Social and Behavioral Sciences (SB): Select one course from two different areas:**
  - 1. Anthropology: ANT 120, 220
  - 2. Geography (Cultural): GEO 202 (Also meets a non-western history/culture requirement for teacher ed)
  - 3. History: HIS 130, 131, 132, 220, 222 (Also meets a western hist/culture requirement for teacher ed)
  - 4. Political Science: PLS 140, (Required for Social Work majors) or PLS 210 or 250
  - 5. Psychology: PSY 102 (Required for Social Work majors)
  - 6. Sociology: SOC 170 (Required for Sociology and Social Work students)
  - 7. Social Science/General: SSC 119, 129
- F. Sciences (S) and Sciences with Lab (SL): Select one course from two different areas, at least one with lab.** All teacher education students need a biology course. Students majoring in sciences, agricultural or environmental sciences areas may need more supporting sciences. Consult UWRF catalog or academic departments.
  - 1. Biology: BIO 103 & 105, BIO 208 (Required for Phy Ed, Social Work, most science and agric sci majors)
  - 2. Chemistry: CHE 110 & 111, 210 (CHE 210 required for most science majors and all agriculture majors)
  - 3. Geology/Earth Sci: PHS 120 (Required for Geology and Conservation majors)
  - 4. Physics/Astronomy: PHY 119, 150&151, 250, 260 (PHY 250 or 260 required for Ag Engr Tech or Food Sci majors)
- G. Mathematics (M):** One course. Math requirement varies by major. Consult catalog or academic department.
  - 1. MAT 101 or higher. MAT 211 or 229 required for Business or Accounting or Agric Business students. MAT 150 or 155 required for all other agriculture majors. MAT 201 & 202 required for Elementary Education majors. MAT 208 or 220 required for Social Work or Psychology majors.
- H. Personal Health and Wellness (HW) and Health/Physical Activity (HA):** This includes a wellness/healthy lifestyle component (HW) and a physical activity (HA) component.
  - 1. Courses which meet the HW component only: HLT 122, 201, PE 136
  - 2. Courses which meet the HA component only: Select 1 credit of PE activity courses PE 101 to 141
- I. Ethical Citizenship (EC):** One course. People and the social or natural environment. BIO 101, JOU 100

### II. OTHER UNIVERSITY-WIDE REQUIREMENTS

These courses may double count in any area of the UWRF degree.

- A. UW System Ethnic/Cultural Diversity Requirement** (One course) This is generally taken at UWRF, but ENG 288 or SOC 200 would satisfy this requirement.
- B. UWRF Global Perspectives Requirement** (One course) A course at an advanced level, which examines subject matter from a global/international perspective. This is usually taken at UWRF.

### III. MAJOR/MINOR COURSES

Additional courses should be selected based on the intended subject area major/minor. Consult the UWRF web site ([www.uwrf.edu](http://www.uwrf.edu)) for links to academic departments, program requirements and the catalog.

- A. College of Agriculture, Food & Environ Sciences (CAFES):** Foundation courses required for all CAFES majors include AGT 140, 160, 170, 210, 215.
- B. College of Business & Economics:** Foundation courses include ACC 121, 122, BUS 256, ECO 260, 261, MAT 211 or 229, MAT 220

**GPA standards and enrollment limits may be placed** on specific majors if needed to stay within program capacity. Consult the UWRF Admissions Office website for transfer admission standards and application priority dates. **Priority consideration** may be given to students who have completed the Communication (English Comp and Speech), Math and Sci requirements prior to transfer. **Transfer after one year is recommended** for teacher education and social work majors.
