



UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN – PLATTEVILLE

Listed below are UW-Platteville (UW-PLT) courses most directly applicable to UW-River Falls Gen Ed requirements. This is intended as a guide for program planning and is subject to revision if Gen Ed requirements or course evaluations change. Students may also check for Gen Ed and program updates in the on-line UWRF catalog at: www.uwrf.edu/catalog.

I. GENERAL EDUCATION

A. Communication – Reading and Writing (CW): Select one from ENGLISH 1130

B. Communication – Advanced (CA): ENGLISH 1230

C. Communication – Speaking and Listening (CS): SPEECH 1010 or 1250 (SPEECH 1250 required for Business, Accounting and Marketing Communication majors.)

D. Humanities and Fine Arts (HF): Select one course from two different areas.

1. Art: ART 2430 (Required for Elementary Education majors)
2. Film: ENGLISH 2250
3. Literature: ENGLISH 1330, 2130, 2230, 2330, 2430, 2530, 2540, 2650, 2730 (Literature is required for all teacher education majors)
4. Music: MUSIC 1590 (Required for Elementary Education majors)
5. Philosophy: PHIL 1130 or 2530
6. Theatre: THEAT 1130 (Required for English Education majors)

E. Social and Behavioral Sciences (SB): Select one course from two different areas:

1. Anthropology: SOCIOLOGY 1130 or 2130
2. Business: BUSADM 1300
3. Geography (Cultural): GEOG 1230, 1330 (Also meets a non-western history/culture requirement for teacher education majors)
4. History: HIST 1010, 1020, 1330, 1430 (Also meets a western history/culture requirement for teacher ed students)
5. Political Science: POLITSCI 1030, 1230, 2430, 3030 (POLITSCI 1230 required for Social Work majors)
6. Psychology: PSYCH 1130 (Required for Social Work majors)
7. Sociology: SOCIOLOGY 1030 (Required for Sociology and Social Work students)

F. Sciences (S) and Sciences with Lab (SL): Select one course from two of the following areas, at least one with lab. All teacher education students need a biology course. Students majoring in sciences, agricultural or environmental sciences areas may need more supporting sciences. Consult UWRF catalog or academic departments.

1. Biology: BIOL 1150, 1650 (Required for Phy. Ed., Social Work, most science and agric sci majors)
2. Chemistry: CHEM 1050, 1140, 1450 (CHEM1140 required for most science and all ag and envir sci majors)
3. Geography (Physical): GEOG 1040, 1140
4. Geology/Earth Sci/Oceanography: GEOL 1140, 3030; GEOG 3540 (GEOL 1140 required for Geology and Conservation majors)
5. Physics/Physical Sci/Astronomy: PHSC 1150, 1340; PHYS 1050, 1110&1140, 2510&2530 (PHYS 1110&1140 or 2510&2530 required for Agric Engineering Tech and Food Science majors)

G. Mathematics (M): Minimum Math requirements vary by major. Consult catalog or academic department.

1. Select 1 from MATH 1030 or higher. MATH 2630 or 2640 required for Business or Accounting majors. MATH 1530 or 2530 or 2450 required for Coll of Agric, Food & Envir Sci majors. MATH 1030 required for Elementary Ed majors. MATH 1830 required for Marketing Communication, Psychology and Social Work majors.

H. Personal Health and Wellness (HW) and Health/Physical Activity (HA): This includes a wellness/healthy lifestyle component (HW) and a physical activity (HA) component.

1. Courses which meet the HW requirement only: PHYSED 1000 or 2030
2. Courses which meet the HA requirement only: Select 1 credit from PHYSED 1040 – 2010

I. Ethical Citizenship (EC): Select one from BIOL 2130, BUSADM 1300, COMM 1250

II. OTHER UNIVERSITY-WIDE REQUIREMENTS These courses may double count in any area of the UWRF degree.

A. UW System Ethnic/Cultural Diversity Requirement (One course) Any UW-PLT course which is identified to satisfy the UW System Ethnic/Cultural Diversity requirement will satisfy this category.

B. UWRF Global Perspectives Requirement (One course) A course at an advanced level, which examines subject matter from a global/international perspective. This is usually taken at UWRF.

III. MAJOR/MINOR COURSES Additional courses should be selected based on the intended subject area major/minor. Consult the UWRF web site (www.uwrf.edu) for links to academic departments, program requirements and the catalog.

A. UWRF College of Agriculture, Food & Environmental Sciences (CAFES) Foundation Courses

Introductory courses from each the general areas offered by UWRF CAFES include UW-PLT AGINDUS 1500, 1750, AGSCI 1000, 1240 or 1260, 2030, 2230

B. UWRF College of Business & Economics – Business Administration or Accounting Majors

The following courses apply toward the foundation course requirements for Business Administration or Accounting majors: ACCOUNTING 2010, 2020; BUSADM 3130; COMMUNIC 3010; COMPUTER 1830; MATH 1830, MATH 2630 or 2640; ECON 2130 and 2230.

GPA standards and enrollment limits may be placed on specific majors if needed to stay within program capacity. Consult the UWRF Admissions Office website for transfer admission standards. **Priority consideration** may be given to students who have completed the Communication (English Composition and Speech), Mathematics and Science requirements prior to transfer. **Transfer after one year is recommended** for teacher education and social work students.
