



SOUTH CENTRAL COMMUNITY & TECHNICAL COLLEGE

Listed below are South Central Comm & Tech College courses most directly applicable to the new UW-River Falls Gen Ed requirements. This is intended as a guide for program planning and is subject to revision if degree requirements or course evaluations change. Students may also check for updates to degree requirements in the catalog at: www.uwrf.edu/catalog.

South Central College is a combined community and technical college. Liberal arts courses are routinely considered for transfer. Courses of a vocational/technical or career education nature may be considered for transfer where related to areas of study offered at UWRF.

I. GENERAL EDUCATION

A. Communication – Reading and Writing (CW): ENGL 100

B. Communication – Advanced (CA): There appears to be no equivalent course at South Central College. Students will need to take ENGL 200 at UWRF.

C. Communication – Speaking and Listening (CS): SPCH 110

D. Humanities and Fine Arts (HF): Select one course from two different areas.

1. Art: ART 100 (Required for Elementary Education majors)
2. Literature: ENGL 110, 120, 130 (Literature is required for all teacher education majors)
3. Music: MUSC 100, 110 (MUSC 100 or 110 required for Elementary Education majors)
4. Philosophy: PHIL 100, 110, 120
5. Theatre: THTR 100 (Required for English Education majors)
6. Humanities/General: HUM 100, 120

E. Social and Behavioral Sciences (SB): Select one course from 2 different areas:

1. Anthropology: ANTH 100
2. Geography (Cultural): GEOG 100, 103 (Also meets a non-western history/culture requirement for teacher ed)
3. History: HIST 120, 121, 160, 161, 162 (Also meets a western hist/culture requirement for teacher ed)
4. Political Science: POL 100, 110 (POL 110 required for Social Work majors)
5. Psychology: PSYC 100 (Required for Social Work majors)
6. Sociology: SOC 101 (Required for Sociology and Social Work students)

F. Sciences (S) and Sciences with Lab (SL): Select one course from two of the following areas, at least one with lab. All teacher education students need a biology course. Students majoring in sciences, agricultural or environmental sciences areas may need more supporting sciences. Consult UWRF catalog or academic departments.

1. Biology: BIOL 100, 106 (Required for Phy Ed, Social Work, most science and agric sci majors)
2. Chemistry: CHEM 108 (Most science majors and all agriculture majors will need to take UWRF CHEM 121)
3. Geography (Physical): GEOG 101
4. Physics/Astronomy: ASTR 101, PHYS 101, 211 (PHYS 211 required for Ag Engr Tech or Food Sci majors)

G. Mathematics (M): Minimum Math requirements vary by major. Consult catalog or academic department.

1. Select 1 from MATH 115 or higher. (MATH 131 required for Business or Accounting majors. MATH 120 or 125 or 130 required for all agriculture majors. MATH 154 required for Psychology or Marketing Communication majors. Elementary Ed majors will take UWRF Math for Elem Teachers at UWRF.)

H. Personal Health and Wellness (HW) and Health/Physical Activity (HA): This includes a wellness/healthy lifestyle component (HW) and a physical activity (HA) component. FCS 105 would satisfy the HW component. There appears to be no equivalent courses at South Central College which would satisfy the HA component.

I. Ethical Citizenship (EC): Select one course from BIOL 101, MASS 110

Students who complete the Associate of Arts Degree are considered to have satisfied UWRF Gen Ed, except for a junior/senior level “Multidisciplinary Inquiry” course, and any specific college, major or professional licensure requirements.

II. OTHER UNIVERSITY-WIDE REQUIREMENTS These courses may double count in any area of the UWRF degree.

A. UW System Ethnic/Cultural Diversity Requirement (One course) This is generally taken at UWRF, but ETHN 100 would meet this requirement.

B. UWRF Global Perspectives Requirement (One course) A course at an advanced level, which examines subject matter from a global/international perspective. This is usually taken at UWRF.

III. MAJOR/MINOR COURSES Additional courses should be selected based on the intended subject area major/minor.

South Central College courses which are of a vocational/technical nature may be considered if related to areas of study offered at UWRF. Consult the UWRF web site (www.uwrf.edu) for links to academic departments, program requirements and the catalog.

A. For College of Agriculture, Food & Environmental Sciences (CAFES) Majors

1. Foundation Courses in Ag, required of all CAFES majors: AGECE 100, ANSC 1100, PLSC 1100, PLSC 1300
2. Other agriculture courses are considered where appropriate to the CAFES major and approved by the major department. For example, courses such as ANSC 1105, 1205, 2100, 2200; PLSC 1105, 1200, 1400, 2700, would routinely apply toward the Animal Science or Crop & Soil Science majors.

B. For Business Administration or Accounting Majors. A 2.25 GPA is required in General Education courses. A 2.5 GPA is required in lower division requirements in the major for admission to the upper level Business Administration or Accounting courses. South Central courses applicable to the lower division requirements in the major include: ACCT 1800 (Business Law); ACCT 1810 (Financial Accounting); ACCT 1811 (Managerial Accounting); ECON 110 (Macroeconomics); ECON 120 (Microeconomics); MATH 131 (Calculus); MATH 154 (Statistics).

C. For Computer Science and Information Systems (CSIS) Majors A 2.25 GPA is required in General Education courses. A 2.5 GPA is required in two semesters of programming and one semester of data structures (or another course approved by the CSIS Department) for admission to the CSIS major. The foundation programming courses in the major (UWRF CSIS 161 & 162) use the JAVA language (Southcentral COMP 2300 & 2305).

GPA standards and enrollment limits may be placed on specific majors if needed to stay within program capacity. Consult the UWRF Admissions Office website for transfer admission standards. **Priority consideration** may be given to students who have completed the Communication (English Composition and Speech), Mathematics and Science requirements prior to transfer. **Transfer after one year is recommended** for teacher education and social work students.
