Listed below are Bay de Noc Community College courses most directly applicable to the UW-River Falls General Education requirements. This is intended as a guide for program planning and is subject to revision if Gen Ed requirements or course evaluations change. Students may check for updates to the General Education and program requirements in the

I. GENERAL EDUCATION

- A. Communication – Reading and Writing (CW):** EN 101
- B. Communication – Advanced (CA):** EN 102
- C. Communication – Speaking and Listening (CS):** CM 104
- D. Humanities and Fine Arts (HF): Select one course from two different areas.**
 - 1. Art: FA 100 (Required for Elementary Education majors)
 - 2. Film: CM 225
 - 3. Literature: EN 200 or 205 or 210 (Literature is required for all teacher education majors)
 - 4. Music: MU 151 or 153 (Required for Elementary Education majors)
 - 5. Philosophy: PI 201 or 204
 - 6. Theatre: FA 210 (Required for English Education majors)
- E. Social and Behavioral Sciences (SB): Select one course from 2 different areas:**
 - 1. Anthropology: AN 201
 - 2. Economics: EC 110 (Required for Social Work majors)
 - 3. Geography (Cultural): GE 121 (Also meets a non-western history/culture requirement for teacher ed students)
 - 4. History: HS 101, 102, 211, 212 (Also meets a western history/culture requirement for teacher education students)
 - 5. Political Science: PS 110 or 111 or 201 (PS 111 required for Social Work majors)
 - 6. Psychology: PY 201 (Required for Social Work majors)
 - 7. Sociology: SO 151 (Required for Sociology and Social Work students)
- F. Sciences (S) and Sciences with Lab (SL): Select one course from two of the following areas, at least one with lab.** All teacher education students need a biology course. Students majoring in sciences, agricultural or environmental sciences areas may need more supporting sciences. Consult UW-RF catalog or academic departments.
 - 1. Biology: BI 103, 110 (BI 110 required for phy. ed., social work, most science, agricultural and envir sci majors)
 - 2. Chemistry: CH 103, 105, 107, 108 (CH 105 required for most science majors and all agriculture majors)
 - 3. Geography (Physical): GE 103
 - 4. Physics/Astronomy: PH 103, 104, 201, 205 (PHYS 201 or 205 required for Ag Engr Tech & Food Sci majors)
- G. Mathematics (M):** Minimum Math requirements vary by major. Consult catalog or academic department.
 - 1. Select 1 from MA 107 or higher. (MA 110 or higher required for agriculture majors. MA 141 required for Business or Accounting majors. MA 130 required for Elementary Education majors.)
- H. Personal Health and Wellness (HW) and Health/Physical Activity (HA):** This includes a wellness/healthy lifestyle component (HW) and a physical activity (HA) component.
 - 1. Courses which meet the HW component: Select 1 from PE 140, 141, 144
 - 2. Courses which meet the HA component: Select 1 credit from PE 110, 114, 116, 118, 119, 124, 218
- I. Ethical Citizenship (EC):** Select one course from BI 107, CM 201, EN 220

Students who complete the Associate of Arts or Associate of Science Degree are considered to have satisfied UW-RF Gen Ed, except for a junior/senior level “Multidisciplinary Inquiry” course, and any specific college, major or professional licensure requirements.

II. OTHER UNIVERSITY-WIDE REQUIREMENTS

These courses may double count in any area of the UW-RF degree.

- A. UW System Ethnic/Cultural Diversity Requirement** (One course) This is generally taken at UW-RF, but SO 103 would meet this requirement.
- B. UW-RF Global Perspectives Requirement** (One course) A course at an advanced level, which examines subject matter from a global/international perspective. This is usually taken at UW-RF.

III. MAJOR/MINOR COURSES

Additional courses should be selected based on the intended subject area major/minor. Consult the UW-RF web site (www.uwrf.edu) for links to academic departments, program requirements and the catalog.

GPA standards and enrollment limits may be placed on specific majors if needed to stay within program capacity. Consult the UW-RF Admissions Office website for transfer admission standards. **Priority consideration** may be given to students who have completed the Communication (English Composition and Speech), Mathematics and Science requirements prior to transfer. **Transfer after one year is recommended** for teacher education, agriculture, and social work students.
