Listed below are Bethany Lutheran College courses most directly applicable UW-River Falls Gen Ed requirements. This is intended as a guide for program planning and is subject to revision if Gen Ed requirements or course evaluations change. I. GENERAL EDUCATION

- A. Communication – Reading and Writing (CW):** CM 105
- B. Communication – Advanced (CA):** CM 225
- C. Communication – Speaking and Listening (CS):** CM 106 (Bus Admin or Mktg Comm majors may take BU 307)
- D. Humanities and Fine Arts (HF): Select one course from two different areas.**
 - 1. Art: AR 101 (Required for Elementary Education majors)
 - 2. Dance: MU 340
 - 3. Literature: EN 200, 201, 202, 203, 204, 211, 212, 220, 304, 305 (Literature is required for all teacher educ majors)
 - 3. Music: MU 103 or 104 (MU 104 required for Elementary Education majors)
 - 4. Philosophy: PL 201, 202, 204, 330
 - 5. Theatre: TH 101 (Required for English Education majors)
- E. Social and Behavioral Sciences (SB): Select one course from 2 different areas:**
 - 1. Anthropology: AN 102
 - 2. Geography (Cultural): GO 102 (Also meets a non-western history/culture requirement for teacher ed students)
 - 3. History: HI 111, 114, 115, 116, 117, 207, 208 (Also meets a western history/culture requirement for teacher education students)
 - 4. Political Science: PS 105, 106 (PS 105 required for Social Work majors)
 - 5. Psychology: PY 201 (Required for Social Work majors)
 - 6. Sociology: SO 101 (Required for Sociology and Social Work students)
- F. Sciences (S) and Sciences with Lab (SL): Select one course from two of the following areas, at least one with lab.** All teacher education students need a biology course. Students majoring in sciences, agricultural or environmental sciences areas may need more supporting sciences. Consult UW-RF catalog or academic departments.
 - 1. Biology: BI 101, 151 (BI 151 required for phy. ed., social work, most science, agricultural and enviro sci majors)
 - 2. Chemistry: CH 100, 105, 107, 113 (CH 113 required for most science majors and all agriculture and enviro sci majors)
 - 3. Geography (Physical): GO 101
 - 4. Physics/Astronomy: PH 101, 151, 213 (PHYS 151 or 213 required for Ag Engr Tech & Food Sci majors)
- G. Mathematics (M):** Minimum Math requirements vary by major. Consult catalog or academic department.
 - 1. Select 1 from MA 110 or higher (MA 111 or 112 required for College of Agriculture majors. MA 141 required for Business or Accounting students.)
- H. Personal Health and Wellness (HW) and Health/Physical Activity (HA):** This includes a wellness/healthy lifestyle component (HW) and a physical activity (HA) component.
 - 1. Courses which meet the HW component: HL 103, 201
 - 2. Courses which meet the HA component: Select 1 credit from PE 106 to 124, or VS 101 to 114
 - 3. Courses which meet both the HW and HA components: PE 215
- I. Ethical Citizenship (EC):** Select one course from CM 240, SC 340

Students who complete the Associate of Arts or Associate of Science Degree are considered to have satisfied UW-RF Gen Ed, except for a junior/senior level “Multidisciplinary Inquiry” course, and any specific college, major or professional licensure requirements.

II. OTHER UNIVERSITY-WIDE REQUIREMENTS

 These courses may double count in any area of the UW-RF degree.

- A. UW System Ethnic/Cultural Diversity Requirement** (One course) This is generally taken at UW-RF, but EN 335 or HI 304 or SO 330 would meet this requirement.
- B. UW-RF Global Perspectives Requirement** (One course) A course at an advanced level, which examines subject matter from a global/international perspective. This is usually taken at UW-RF.

III. MAJOR/MINOR COURSES

 Additional courses should be selected based on the intended subject area major/minor. Consult the UW-RF web site (www.uwrf.edu) for links to academic departments, program requirements and the catalog.

GPA standards and enrollment limits may be placed on specific majors if needed to stay within program capacity. Consult the UW-RF Admissions Office website for transfer admission standards. **Priority consideration** may be given to students who have completed the Communication (English Composition and Speech), Mathematics and Science requirements prior to transfer. **Transfer after one year is recommended** for teacher education, agriculture, and social work students.
