Listed below are Central Lakes College (CLC) courses most directly applicable to UW-River Falls General Education requirements. This is intended as a guide for program planning and is subject to revision if Gen Ed requirements or course evaluations change. I. GENERAL EDUCATION

A. Communication – Reading and Writing (CW): ENGL 1410

B. Communication – Advanced (CA): ENGL 1411

C. Communication – Speaking and Listening (CS): SPCH 1431 or 1410

D. Humanities and Fine Arts (HF): Select one course from two different areas.

1. Art: ARTS 1470 (Required for Elementary Education majors)

2. Film: ENGL 1454

3. Literature: ENGL 1463, 2457, 2458, 2467, 2468 (Literature is required for all teacher education majors)

4. Music: MUSC 1457, 1459 (Required for Elementary Education majors)

5. Philosophy: PHIL 1421, 2410, 2420, 2430

6. Theatre: THTR 1451, 2450 (Required for English Education majors)

7. Humanities/General: ENGL 1450

E. Social and Behavioral Sciences (SB): Select one course from 2 different areas:

1. Anthropology: ANTH 1457

2. Economics: ECON 1450 (Required for Social Work majors)

3. Geography (Cultural): GEOG 1421, 1459 (Also meets a non-western history/culture requirement for teacher ed)

4. History: HIST 1406, 1407, 1412, 1413, 1472, 1473 (Also meets a western hist/culture requirement for tchr ed)

5. Political Science: POLS 1430, 1435, 2450 (POLS 1435 required for Social Work majors)

6. Psychology: PSYC 2421 (Required for Social Work majors)

7. Sociology: SOCL 1401 (Required for Sociology and Social Work students)

F. Sciences (S) and Sciences with Lab (SL): Select one course from two of the following areas, at least one with lab. All teacher education students need a biology course. Students majoring in sciences, agricultural or environmental sciences areas may need more supporting sciences. Consult UW-RF catalog or academic departments.

1. Biology: BIOL 1411, 1431 (BIOL 1431 required for Phy Ed, Social Work, most science and agric sci majors)

2. Chemistry: CHEM 1405, 1410, 1414, 1424 (CHEM 1424 required for most sci majors and all agriculture majors)

3. Geography (Physical): GEOG 1400

4. Geology/Earth Sci: ESCI 1411, 1451 (& 1452 Lab) (ESCI 1411 required for Geology and Conservation majors)

5. Physics/Astronomy: PHYS 1401, 1405, 1406, 1411 (PHYS 1401 or 1411 required for Ag Engr Tech or Food Sci)

G. Mathematics (M): Minimum Math requirements vary by major. Consult catalog or academic department.

1. Select 1 from MATH 1441 or higher (MATH 1477 required for Business or Accounting students. MATH 1470 or 1472 required for all agriculture majors.)

H. Personal Health and Wellness (HW) and Health/Physical Activity (HA): This includes a wellness/healthy lifestyle component (HW) and a physical activity (HA) component.

1. Courses which meet both the HW and HA requirements: PHED 1594

2. Courses which meet the HW component only: HLTH 1501

3. Courses which meet the HA component only: Select 1 credit from PHED 1502 to 1553, or PHED 2501 to 2519

I. Ethical Citizenship (EC): Select one course from ENVR 1400 or MCOM 1450 or BIOL 1415 or ESCI 1454

Students who complete the Associate of Arts Degree are considered to have satisfied UW-RF Gen Ed, except for a junior/senior level "Multidisciplinary Inquiry" course, and any specific college, major or professional licensure requirements.

II. OTHER UNIVERSITY-WIDE REQUIREMENTS These courses may double count in any area of the UW-RF degree.

A. UW System Ethnic/Cultural Diversity Requirement (One course) This is generally taken at UW-RF, but ENGL 2455 or HIST 2411 or SOCL 2481 would meet this requirement.

B. UW-RF Global Perspectives Requirement (One course) A course at an advanced level, which examines subject matter from a global/international perspective. This is usually taken at UW-RF.

III. MAJOR/MINOR COURSES Additional courses should be selected based on the intended subject area major/minor. Consult the UW-RF web site (www.uwrf.edu) for links to academic departments, program requirements and the catalog.

GPA standards and enrollment limits may be placed on specific majors if needed to stay within program capacity. Consult the UW-RF Admissions Office website for transfer admission standards. **Priority consideration** may be given to students who have completed the Communication (English Composition and Speech), Mathematics and Science requirements prior to transfer. **Transfer after one year is recommended** for teacher education, agriculture, and social work students.
