



UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA - CROOKSTON

Listed below are University of Minnesota – Crookston courses most directly applicable to UW-River Falls Gen Ed requirements. This is intended as a guide for program planning and is subject to revision if degree requirements or course evaluations change. Students may also check for updates to the Gen Ed and other degree requirements in the UWRF catalog at: www.uwrf.edu/catalog.

I. GENERAL EDUCATION

- A. Communication – Reading and Writing (CW):** COMP 1011
- B. Communication – Advanced (CA):** COMP 1013
- C. Communication – Speaking and Listening (CS):** SPCH 1101
- D. Humanities and Fine Arts (HF): Select one course from two different areas.**
 - 1. Humanities/General: HUM 1301
 - 2. Literature: LIT 1005, 1016, 3001 (Literature is required for all teacher education majors)
 - 3. Music: MUS 1021 (Required for Elementary Education majors)
 - 4. Philosophy: PHIL 1001
- E. Social and Behavioral Sciences (SB): Select one course from two different areas:**
 - 1. Anthropology: SOC 1102
 - 2. Geography (Cultural): GEOG 1104 (Also meets a non-western history/culture requirement for teacher ed)
 - 3. History: HIST 1021, 1022, 1301, 1302 (Also meets a western hist/culture requirement for teacher ed)
 - 4. Political Science: POL 1001 (Required for Social Work majors) or POL 1054
 - 5. Psychology: PSY 1001 (Required for Social Work majors)
 - 6. Sociology: SOC 1001 (Required for Sociology and Social Work students)
- F. Sciences (S) and Sciences with Lab (SL): Select one course from two different areas, at least one with lab.** All teacher education students need a biology course. Students majoring in sciences, agricultural or environmental sciences areas may need more supporting sciences. Consult UWRF catalog or academic departments.
 - 1. Biology: BIOL 1009 (Required for Phy Ed, Social Work, most science and agric sci majors)
 - 2. Chemistry: CHEM 101, 1021 (CHEM 1021 required for most science majors and all agriculture majors)
 - 3. Geology/Earth Sci: GEOL 1001 (Required for Geology and Conservation majors)
 - 4. Physics/Astronomy: PHYS 1001, 1012, 1101 (PHYS 1101 required for Ag Engr Tech or Food Sci)
- G. Mathematics (M):** One course. Math requirement varies by major. Consult catalog or academic department.
 - 1. MATH 1011 or higher. MATH 1142 or 1271 required for Business or Accounting students. MATH 1031 or 1250 required for all agriculture majors. MATH 101 required for Elementary Education majors. MATH 1150 for Social Work or Psychology majors.
- H. Personal Health and Wellness (HW) and Health/Physical Activity (HA):** This includes a wellness/healthy lifestyle component (HW) and a physical activity (HA) component.
 - 1. Courses which meet the HW component only: HLTH 1072
 - 2. Courses which meet the HA component only: Select 1 credit from PER 1151 to 1791
- I. Ethical Citizenship (EC):** One course. People and the social or natural environment. NATR 1233

Students who complete the Associate of Arts Degree are considered to have satisfied UWRF Gen Ed, except for a junior/senior level “Multidisciplinary Inquiry” course, and any specific college, major or professional licensure requirements.

II. OTHER UNIVERSITY-WIDE REQUIREMENTS

 These courses may double count in any area of the UWRF degree.

- A. UW System Ethnic/Cultural Diversity Requirement** (One course) This is generally taken at UWRF.
- B. UWRF Global Perspectives Requirement** (One course) A course at an advanced level, which examines subject matter from a global/international perspective. This is usually taken at UWRF.

III. MAJOR/MINOR COURSES

 Additional courses should be selected based on the intended subject area major/minor. Consult the UWRF web site (www.uwrf.edu) for links to academic departments, program requirements and the catalog.

A. College of Agriculture, Food & Environ Sciences: Foundation courses include AGECE 3050, ANSC 1004, ASM 1021, HORT 1010, SOIL 1293

B. College of Business & Economics: Foundation courses include ACCT 2101, 2102, 3321, ECON 2101, 2102, MATH 1142 or 1271, MATH 1150

GPA standards and enrollment limits may be placed on specific majors if needed to stay within program capacity. Consult the UWRF Admissions Office website for transfer admission standards and application priority dates. **Priority consideration** may be given to students who have completed the Communication (English Comp and Speech), Math and Sci requirements prior to transfer. **Transfer after one year is recommended** for teacher education and social work majors.
