## C. DCTC EXERCISE AND SPORT SCIENCE PROGRAM

The UW-RF Health & Human Performance Department (H&HP) has reviewed DCTC Exercise and Sports Science (EXER) courses. **Student should be advised that enrollment in UW-RF H&HP programs is limited.** A 3.0 GPA is typically required for teacher certification majors in Physical Education or Health Education. A 2.5 GPA is required for the non-teaching certification option. Students should apply early, as this program may reach enrollment targets earlier than most other UW-RF majors.
