Listed below are Minnesota State Comm & Tech College (MSCTC) courses most directly applicable to UWRF Gen Ed requirements. This is intended as a guide for program planning and is subject to revision if Gen Ed requirements or course evaluations change. I. GENERAL EDUCATION

A. Communication – Reading and Writing (CW): ENGL 1101

B. Communication – Advanced (CA): ENGL 1102

C. Communication – Speaking and Listening (CS): SPCH 1114

D. Humanities and Fine Arts (HF): Select one course from two different areas.

1. Art: ART 1110 (Required for Elementary Education majors)

2. Film: HUM 2210

3. Literature: ENGL 2302, 2230, 2331, 2332, 2361, 2362 (Literature is required for all teacher education majors)

4. Music: MUSC 1115, 1116, 1111 (MUSC 1116 required for Elementary Education majors)

5. Philosophy: PHIL 1130, 1211, 1201, 2220

6. Theatre: THTR 1111 (Required for English Education majors)

7. Humanities/General: HUM 1101

E. Social and Behavioral Sciences (SB): Select one course from 2 different areas:

1. Anthropology: ANTH 1100

2. Economics: ECON 1150 (Required for Social Work majors)

3. Geography (Human/Cultural): GEOG 1110

4. History: HIST 2211, 2212, 2213, 1110, 1111, 1112, 1113 (Also meets a western history/culture requirement for teacher education students)

5. Political Science: PSCI 1112, 2204, 2206 (PSYC 1112 required for Social Work majors)

6. Psychology: PSYC 1200 (Required for Social Work majors)

7. Sociology: SOC 1111 (Required for Sociology and Social Work students)

F. Sciences (S) and Sciences with Lab (SL): Select one course from two of the following areas, at least one with lab. All teacher education students need a biology course. Students majoring in sciences, agricultural or environmental sciences areas may need more supporting sciences. Consult UW-RF catalog or academic departments.

1. Biology: BIOL 1111 (Required for Phy Ed, Social Work, most science and agric sci majors)

2. Chemistry: CHEM 1100, 1101, 1111 (CHEM 1111 required for most science and all agriculture majors)

3. Food Science: BIOL 1152

4. Physics/Astronomy: PHYS 1105, 1106, 1120, 1401, 1411 (PHYS 1401 or 1411 required for Agric Engr Tech or Food Science)

G. Mathematics (M): (One course) Math requirement varies by major. Consult catalog or academic department.

1. MATH 1114 or 1115 required for all agriculture majors. MATH 1120 or 1134 required for Business or Accounting students. MATH 2200 required for Elementary Educ majors. MATH 1100 for humanities/fine arts majors.

H. Personal Health and Wellness (HW) and Health/Physical Activity (HA): This includes a wellness/healthy lifestyle component (HW) and a physical activity (HA) component.

1. Courses which meet both the HW and HA component: PE 1109

2. Courses which meet the HW component only: HLTH 1111

3. Courses which meet the HA component only: Select 2 from PHED 1110 to 1199.

I. Ethical Citizenship (EC): Select one from BUS 1146, BIOL 1107, JOUR 1131, PHIL 2220, PHYS 1101, SW 2250

Students who complete the Associate of Arts Degree are considered to have satisfied UW-RF Gen Ed, except for a junior/senior level "Multidisciplinary Inquiry" course, and any specific college, major or professional licensure requirements.

II. OTHER UNIVERSITY-WIDE REQUIREMENTS These courses may double count in any area of the UW-RF degree.

A. UW System Ethnic/Cultural Diversity Requirement (One course) This is generally taken at UW-RF, but HUM 1110 or MCS 2230 or SOC 2216 would meet this requirement.

B. UW-RF Global Perspectives Requirement (One course) A course at an advanced level, which examines subject matter from a global/international perspective. This is usually taken at UW-RF.

III. MAJOR/MINOR COURSES Additional courses should be selected based on the intended subject area major/minor.

Consult the UW-RF web site (www.uwrf.edu) for links to academic departments, program requirements and the catalog.

GPA standards and enrollment limits may be placed on specific majors if needed to stay within program capacity. Consult the UW-RF Admissions Office website for transfer admission standards. **Priority consideration** may be given to students who have completed the Communication (English Composition and Speech), Mathematics and Science requirements prior to transfer. **Transfer after one year is recommended** for teacher education, agriculture, and social work students.
