Listed below are Gogebic Community College courses most directly applicable to UW-River Falls Gen. Ed. requirements. This is intended as a guide for program planning and is subject to revision if Gen Ed requirements or course evaluations change. Students should also check for updates to the Gen Ed and program requirements in the on-line UW-RF catalog at:

I. GENERAL EDUCATION

- A. Communication – Reading and Writing (CW):** ENG 101 or 111
- B. Communication – Advanced (CA):** ENG 102 or 112
- C. Communication – Speaking and Listening (CS):** SPE 101 or 111
- D. Humanities and Fine Arts (HF): Select one course from two different areas.**
 - 1. Art: ART 220 or 221 (ART 220 required for Elementary Education majors)
 - 2. Film: DRA 102 or 202
 - 3. Literature: ENG 221 or 201 or 202 or 211 or 212 or 223 or 226 (Literature is required for all teacher ed majors)
 - 4. Music: MUS 102 or 125 (MUS 102 required for Elementary Education majors)
 - 5. Theatre: DRA 101 or 230 (Required for English Education majors)
 - 6. Philosophy: PHI 105 or 201
- E. Social and Behavioral Sciences (SB): Select one course from 2 different areas:**
 - 1. Anthropology: ANT 105
 - 2. Economics: ECO 101 (Required for Social Work majors)
 - 3. Geography (Cultural): GEG 111 (Also meets a non-western history/culture requirement for teacher ed students)
 - 4. History: HST 101 or 102 or 103 or 104 or 201 or 202 (Also meets a western history/culture requirement for teacher education students)
 - 5. Political Science: PLS 101 (Required for Social Work majors)
 - 6. Psychology: PSY 101 or 111 (Required for Social Work majors)
 - 7. Sociology: SOC 101 (Required for Sociology and Social Work students)
- F. Sciences (S) and Sciences with Lab (SL): Select one course from two of the following areas, at least one with lab.** All teacher education students need a biology course. Students majoring in sciences, agricultural or environmental sciences areas may need more supporting sciences. Consult UW-RF catalog or academic departments.
 - 1. Biology: BIO 101 or 102 (Required for phy. ed., social work, most science, agricultural and envir sci majors)
 - 2. Chemistry: CHM 101 or 151 (CHM 151 required for most science majors and all agriculture and envir sci majors)
 - 3. Geography (Physical): GEG 101
 - 4. Geology/Earth Science: GLG 101 or 102 (Required for Geology or Conservation majors)
 - 5. Physics/Astronomy: PHY 101 or 105 or 201 or 251 (PHY 201 or 251 required for Ag Engr Tech & Food Sci majors)
- G. Mathematics (M):** Minimum Math requirements vary by major. Consult catalog or academic department.
 - 1. Select 1 from MTH 110 or higher (MTH 110 required for agriculture students. MTH 150 required for Business or Accounting students. MTH 121 and 122 required for Elementary Education students.)
- H. Personal Health and Wellness (HW) and Health/Physical Activity (HA):** This includes a wellness/healthy lifestyle component (HW) and a physical activity (HA) component.
 - 1. Courses which meet the entire HW and HA requirement (2 credits): PEH 110 or 112 or 116
 - 2. Courses which meet the HW component: Select 1 from PEH 101 or PED 213 or HED 101 or 120 or 130
 - 3. Courses which meet the HA component: Select 1 credit from PED 101 to 230 (except PED 103, 202, 203, 212, 213, 223)
- I. Ethical Citizenship (EC):** Select one course from ENV 101 or JRN 101

II. OTHER UNIVERSITY-WIDE REQUIREMENTS

These courses may double count in any area of the UW-RF degree.

- A. UW System American Ethnic/Cultural Diversity Requirement** (One course) This is usually taken at UW-RF, but ANT 225 would meet the requirement.
- B. UW-RF Global Perspectives Requirement** (One course) A course at an advanced level, which examines subject matter from a global/international perspective. This is usually taken at UW-RF.

III. MAJOR/MINOR COURSES

Additional courses should be selected based on the intended subject area major/minor. Consult the UW-RF web site (www.uwrf.edu) for links to academic departments, program requirements and the catalog.

GPA standards and enrollment limits may be placed on specific majors if needed to stay within program capacity. Consult the UW-RF Admissions Office website for transfer admission standards. **Priority consideration** may be given to students who have completed the English Composition, Speech, Mathematics and Science requirements prior to transfer. **Transfer after one year is recommended** for teacher education, agriculture, and social work students.
