Listed below are Itasca Community College courses most directly applicable to the new UW-River Falls Gen Ed requirements. This is intended as a guide for program planning and is subject to revision if Gen Ed requirements or course evaluations change. Students may also check for updates to the General Education and program requirements in the on-line UW-RF catalog at: www.uwrf.edu/catalog.

I. GENERAL EDUCATION

- A. Communication – Reading and Writing (CW):** ENGL 1101
- B. Communication – Advanced (CA):** ENGL 1109 or 1113
- C. Communication – Speaking and Listening (CS):** SPCH 1101 or 1105
- D. Humanities and Fine Arts (HF): Select one course from two different areas.**
 - 1. Art: ART 1101 (Required for Elementary Education majors)
 - 2. Literature: ENGL 2100 or 2101 or 1202 or 2110 (Literature is required for all teacher ed majors)
 - 3. Music: MUS 1111 or 1101 (MUS 1111 required for Elementary Education majors)
 - 4. Philosophy: PHIL 1101 or 1111
 - 5. Theatre: THTR 1101 (Required for English Education majors)
- E. Social and Behavioral Sciences (SB): Select one course from 2 different areas:**
 - 1. Anthropology: ANTH 1100 or 1102
 - 2. Economics: ECON 1101 (Required for Social Work majors)
 - 3. Geography (Cultural): GEOG 1104 or 1108 (Also meets a non-western history/culture requirement for teacher education students)
 - 4. History: HIST 1111 or 1112 or 1131 or 1132 (Also meets a western history/culture requirement for teacher educ)
 - 5. Political Science: POLS 1101 (Required for Social Work majors)
 - 6. Psychology: PSYC 1101 (Required for Social Work majors)
 - 7. Sociology: SOC 1101 (Required for Sociology and Social Work students)
- F. Sciences (S) and Sciences with Lab (SL): Select one course from two of the following areas, at least one with lab.** All teacher education students need a biology course. Students majoring in sciences, agricultural or environmental sciences areas may need more supporting sciences. Consult UW-RF catalog or academic departments.
 - 1. Biology: BIOL 1201 (Required for phy. ed., social work, most science, agricultural and envir sci majors)
 - 2. Chemistry: CHEM 1101 or 1201 (CHEM 1201 required for most science majors and all agric and envir sci majors)
 - 3. Geography (Physical): GEOG 1101
 - 4. Geology/Earth Science: NSCI 1121 (Required for Geology or Conservation majors)
 - 5. Physics/Astronomy: NSCI 1111 or PHYS 1101 or 1201 (PHYS 1101 or 1201 required for Ag Engr Tech & Food Science majors)
- G. Mathematics (M):** Minimum Math requirements vary by major. Consult catalog or academic department.
 - 1. Select 1 from MATH 1100 or higher (MATH 1111 or 1121 required for agriculture students. MATH 1122 required for Business or Accounting students. MATH 1100 required for Elementary Education students.)
- H. Personal Health and Wellness (HW) and Health/Physical Activity (HA):** This includes a wellness/healthy lifestyle component (HW) and a physical activity (HA) component.
 - 1. Courses which meet the HW component: PE 1201 or HLTH 1140 or 1202
 - 2. Courses which meet the HA component: Select 1 credit from PE 1101 to 1168
- I. Ethical Citizenship (EC):** Select one course from JOUR 1101 or NSCI 1101

Students who complete the Associate of Arts Degree are considered to have satisfied UW-RF Gen Ed, except for a junior/senior level “Multidisciplinary Inquiry” courses, and any specific college, major or professional licensure requirements.

- II. OTHER UNIVERSITY-WIDE REQUIREMENTS** These courses may double count in any area of the UW-RF degree.
 - A. UW System American Ethnic/Cultural Diversity Requirement** (One course) This is usually taken at UW-RF, but ENGL 2135 or HIST 1142 or MCS 1101 or MCS 1111 would meet the requirement.
 - B. UW-RF Global Perspectives Requirement** (One course) A course at an advanced level, which examines subject matter from a global/international perspective. This is usually taken at UW-RF.

III. MAJOR/MINOR COURSES Additional courses should be selected based on the intended subject area major/minor. Consult the UW-RF web site (www.uwrf.edu) for links to academic departments, program requirements and the catalog.

GPA standards and enrollment limits may be placed on specific majors if needed to stay within program capacity. Consult the UW-RF Admissions Office website for transfer admission standards. **Priority consideration** may be given to students who have completed the English Composition, Speech, Mathematics and Science requirements prior to transfer. **Transfer after one year is recommended** for teacher education, agriculture, and social work students.
