



## MINNESOTA STATE, MANKATO

Listed below are Minnesota State, Mankato courses most directly applicable to UW-River Falls Gen Ed requirements. This is intended as a guide for program planning and is subject to revision if Gen Ed requirements or course evaluations change. ### I. GENERAL EDUCATION

- A. Communication – Reading and Writing (CW):** ENG 101
- B. Communication – Advanced (CA):** ENG 201
- C. Communication – Speaking and Listening (CS):** SPEE 100 or 102 or 212 or 233
- D. Humanities and Fine Arts (HF): Select one course from two different areas.**
  - 1. Art: ART 100 or 160 (ART 100 required for Elementary Education majors)
  - 2. Literature: ENG 110, 112, 113, 211, 212, 213 (Literature is required for all teacher education majors)
  - 3. Film: ENG 114
  - 4. MUS 120, 130 (MUS 120 required for Elementary Education majors)
  - 5. PHIL 100, 120
  - 6. THEA 100 or 115 (Required for English Education majors)
- E. Social and Behavioral Sciences (SB): Select one course from 2 different areas:**
  - 1. ANTH 101
  - 2. ECON 100 (Required for Social Work majors)
  - 3. GEOG 100, 103 (Also meets a non-western history/culture requirement for teacher education students)
  - 4. HIST 170, 171, 180, 181, 190, 191 (Any one also meets a western history/culture requirement for teacher education students), HIST 160 (Also meets a non-western history/culture requirement for teacher educ students)
  - 5. POL 100, 106, 111, 231, 241 (POL 111 required for Social Work majors)
  - 6. PSYC 101 (Required for Social Work majors)
  - 7. SOC 101 (Required for Sociology and Social Work students)
- F. Sciences (S) and Sciences with Lab (SL): Select one course from two of the following areas, at least one with lab.** Students majoring in sciences, agricultural or environmental sciences areas may need more supporting sciences. Consult UW-RF catalog or academic departments.
  - 1. BIOL 100, 105 (BIOL 105 required for phy. ed., social work, most science, agricultural and envir sci majors. A biology course is also required for all teacher education students.)
  - 2. CHEM 100, 104, 106, 191, 201 (CHEM 201 required for most science and all agriculture and envir sci majors)
  - 3. GEOG 101
  - 4. Geology/Earth Science: GEOL 100 or 121 (GEOL 121 required for Geology or Conservation majors)
  - 5. Physics/Astronomy: AST 101, 102, 104, 115, 125, 201, PHYS 100, 101, 102, 211, 221 (PHYS 211 or 221 required for Ag. Engineering Tech. & Food Science majors)
- G. Mathematics (M):** Minimum Math requirements vary by major. Consult catalog or academic department.
  - 1. Select 1 from STAT 154, PSYC 201, or MATH 110 or higher (STAT 154 or PSYC 201 required for Psychology or Marketing Comm majors. MATH 112 or higher required for all College of Agriculture, Food & Envir Sci majors. MATH 121 or 181 required for Business or Accounting students. MATH 201 required for Elementary Ed majors.)
- H. Personal Health and Wellness (HW) and Health/Physical Activity (HA):** This includes a wellness/healthy lifestyle component (HW) and a physical activity (HA) component.
  - 1. Courses which meet the HW component only: HP 103 or 104 or HLTH 101
  - 2. Courses which meet the HA component only: Any 1 credit PE activity course (HP 101 - 245)
- I. Ethical Citizenship (EC):** Select one from ENVR 101, FINA 100, GEOL 350, MASS 110, PHIL 224, SOWK 190

### II. OTHER UNIVERSITY-WIDE REQUIREMENTS

- A. UW System Ethnic/Cultural Diversity Requirement** (One course) This is usually taken at UW-RF, but courses such as ENG 318, ETHN 100, 101, 201, 202, 203, 204, HIST 151, would fit in this category.
- B. UW-RF Global Perspectives Requirement** (One course) An advanced level course which examines subject matter from a global/international perspective. This is usually taken at UW-RF.
