I. Transfer of General Courses

III. Other PTC Courses

Students with PTC courses which may be related to UWRF degree programs, but which are not included in the general transfer agreement or programmatic agreements, may consult the appropriate UWRF academic department. At the discretion of the UWRF department, students may be awarded credit based on individual course review, departmental examination, portfolio development, or other demonstration of proficiency.
