



## RAINY RIVER COMMUNITY COLLEGE

Listed below are Rainy River Community College (RRCC) courses most directly applicable to the UW-River Falls Gen. Ed. requirements. This is intended as a guide for program planning and is subject to revision if Gen Ed requirements or course evaluations change. Students may check for updates to Gen Ed and program requirements in the UW-RF catalog:

### I. GENERAL EDUCATION

- A. Communication – Reading and Writing (CW):** ENGL 1010
- B. Communication – Advanced (CA):** ENGL 1020
- C. Communication – Speaking and Listening (CS):** SPCH 1020
- D. Humanities and Fine Arts (HF): Select one course from two different areas.**
  - 1. Art: ART 1040 (Required for Elementary Education majors)
  - 2. Literature: ENGL 1200, 1400, 2310 (Literature is required for all teacher education majors)
  - 3. Film: FILM 1020
  - 3. Music: MUSC 1220 or 1200 (MUSC 1220 required for Elementary Education majors)
  - 4. Philosophy: PHIL 1020, 1050
  - 5. Theatre: THTR 1210 (Required for English Education majors)
- E. Social and Behavioral Sciences (SB): Select one course from 2 different areas:**
  - 1. Anthropology: SOC 1430
  - 2. Economics: ECON 1010 (Required for Social Work majors)
  - 3. Geography (Cultural): GEOG 1200, 2200 (Also meets a non-western history/culture requirement for teacher ed)
  - 4. History: HIST 1240, 1250, 1340, 1350 (Also meets a western hist/culture requirement for teacher education)
  - 5. Political Science: PSCI 1310, 2000 (POLS 1310 required for Social Work majors)
  - 6. Psychology: PSYC 1010 (Required for Social Work majors)
  - 7. Sociology: SOC 1100 (Required for Sociology and Social Work students)
- F. Sciences (S) and Sciences with Lab (SL): Select one course from two of the following areas, at least one with lab.** All teacher education students need a biology course. Students majoring in sciences, agricultural or environmental sciences areas may need more supporting sciences. Consult UW-RF catalog or academic departments.
  - 1. Biology: NSCI 1080, BIOL 1010 (BIOL 1010 required for Phy Ed, Social Work, most science and agric sci majors)
  - 2. Chemistry: NSCI 1050, CHEM 1500, 1090 (CHEM 1090 required for most science and all agriculture majors)
  - 3. Geography (Physical): GEOG 2100
  - 4. Geology/Earth Sci: NSCI 1310 (Required for Geology and Conservation majors)
  - 5. Physics/Astronomy: NSCI 1060, 1360, PHYS 1100, 2100 (PHYS 1100 or 2100 required for Agriculture Engineering Tech or Food Science)
- G. Mathematics (M):** (One course) Math requirement varies by major. Consult catalog or academic department.
  - 1. MATH 1140 or 1170 required for all agriculture majors. MATH 2220 required for Business or Accounting students. MATH 1010 and 1013 required for Elementary Education majors. MATH 1200 for humanities/fine arts majors.
- H. Personal Health and Wellness (HW) and Health/Physical Activity (HA):** This includes a wellness/healthy lifestyle component (HW) and a physical activity (HA) component.
  - 1. Courses which meet the HW component only: HLTH 1810, 1850
  - 2. Courses which meet the HA component only: Select 1 credit from PHED 1040 to 1280; 1340 to 1730.
- I. Ethical Citizenship (EC):** Select one course from NSCI 1110 or MCOM 1000.

**Students who complete the Associate of Arts Degree** are considered to have satisfied UW-RF Gen Ed, except for a junior/senior level “Multidisciplinary Inquiry” course, and any specific college, major or professional licensure requirements.

### II. OTHER UNIVERSITY-WIDE REQUIREMENTS

These courses may double count in any area of the UW-RF degree.

- A. UW System Ethnic/Cultural Diversity Requirement** (One course) This is generally taken at UW-RF, but INDG 1010 or HIST 1500 or SOC 2500 would meet this requirement.
- B. UW-RF Global Perspectives Requirement** (One course) A course at an advanced level, which examines subject matter from a global/international perspective. This is usually taken at UW-RF.

### III. MAJOR/MINOR COURSES

Additional courses should be selected based on the intended subject area major/minor. Consult the UW-RF web site ([www.uwrf.edu](http://www.uwrf.edu)) for links to academic departments, program requirements and the catalog.

**GPA standards and enrollment limits may be placed** on specific majors if needed to stay within program capacity. Consult the UW-RF Admissions Office website for transfer admission standards. **Priority consideration** may be given to students who have completed the Communication (English Composition and Speech), Mathematics and Science requirements prior to transfer. **Transfer after one year is recommended** for teacher education, agriculture, and social work students.
