Listed below are Southwest Minnesota State courses most directly applicable to UW-River Falls Gen Ed requirements. This is intended as a guide for program planning and is subject to revision if Gen Ed requirements or course evaluations change. I. GENERAL EDUCATION

- A. Communication – Reading and Writing (CW):** ENGL 102
- B. Communication – Advanced (CA):** ENGL 103
- C. Communication – Speaking and Listening (CS):** SPCH 110
- D. Humanities and Fine Arts (HF): Select one course from two different areas.**
 - 1. Art: ART 100 (Required for Elementary Education majors)
 - 2. Dance: PE 100
 - 3. Literature: LIT 100, 120, 150, 170 (Literature is required for all teacher education majors)
 - 4. Film: THTR 220
 - 5. Music: MUS 100, 101 (MUS 100 required for Elementary Education majors)
 - 6. Philosophy: PHIL 100, 101, 103
 - 7. Theatre: THTR 100 (Required for English Education majors)
- E. Social and Behavioral Sciences (SB): Select one course from 2 different areas:**
 - 1. Anthropology (Cultural): ANTH 101, 116
 - 2. Economics: ECON 110 (Required for Social Work majors)
 - 3. Geography (Human/Cultural): RURL 201 (Also meets a non-western history/culture requirement for teacher education students)
 - 4. History: HIST 221, 222, 242, 243 (Any one also meets a western history/culture requirement for teacher education students)
 - 5. POL 117, 120, 200, 252 (POL 120 required for Social Work majors)
 - 6. PSYC 101 (Required for Social Work majors)
 - 7. SOC 101, 102 (Required for Sociology and Social Work students)
- F. Sciences (S) and Sciences with Lab (SL): Select one course from two of the following areas, at least one with lab.** Students majoring in sciences, agricultural or environmental sciences areas may need more supporting sciences. Consult UWRF catalog or academic departments.
 - 1. Biology: BIOL 100 (Required for phy. ed., social work, most science, agricultural and envir sci majors. A biology course is also required for all teacher education students.)
 - 2. Chemistry: CHEM 110, 111, 121, 231 (CHEM 231 required for most science and all agriculture and envir sci majors)
 - 3. Geography (Physical): RURL 101
 - 4. Geology/Earth Science: ENVS 101 (Required for Geology or Conservation majors)
 - 5. Physics/Astronomy: PHYS 100, 120, 121, 141, 181 (PHYS 141 or 181 required for Ag. Engineering Tech. & Food Science majors)
- G. Mathematics (M):** Minimum Math requirements vary by major. Consult catalog or academic department.
 - 1. Select 1 from PSYC 200, or MATH 101 or higher (PSYC 201 or MATH 200 required for Psychology or Marketing Comm majors. MATH 110 or higher required for all College of Agriculture, Food & Envir Sci majors. MATH 140 or 150 required for Business or Accounting students. MATH 127 required for Elementary Ed majors.)
- H. Personal Health and Wellness (HW) and Health/Physical Activity (HA):** This includes a wellness/healthy lifestyle component (HW) and a physical activity (HA) component.
 - 1. Courses which meet both the HW & HA requirements: HLTH 100
 - 2. Courses which meet the HW component only: HLTH 112, 220
 - 3. Courses which meet the HA component only: Any 1 credit PE activity course (PE 107, 109-121, 130-153, 158-177)
- I. Ethical Citizenship (EC):** Select one from ENVS 180, PHIL 105, SWRK 150

II. OTHER UNIVERSITY-WIDE REQUIREMENTS

- A. UW System Ethnic/Cultural Diversity Requirement** (One course) This is usually taken at UWRF, but courses such as LIT 355, HIST 359, SOCI 331, would fit in this category.
- B. UW-RF Global Perspectives Requirement** (One course) An advanced level course which examines subject matter from a global/international perspective. This is usually taken at UW-RF.

III. MAJOR/MINOR COURSES Additional courses should be selected based on the intended subject area major/minor. Consult the UW-RF web site (www.uwrf.edu) for links to academic departments, program requirements and the catalog.
