Listed below are Saint Cloud State courses most directly applicable to UW-River Falls Gen Ed requirements. This is intended as a guide for program planning and is subject to revision if Gen Ed requirements or course evaluations change. Students may also check for updates to Gen Ed and program requirements in the catalog: www.uwrf.edu/catalog.

I. GENERAL EDUCATION

- A. Communication – Reading and Writing (CW):** ENGL 191 or 198
- B. Communication – Advanced (CA):** ENGL 331 or 332 or 333
- C. Communication – Speaking and Listening (CS):** CMST 192 or 211
- D. Humanities and Fine Arts (HF): Select one course from two different areas.**
 - 1. Art: ART 131 (Required for Elementary Education majors)
 - 2. Film: FS 175, 260
 - 3. Humanities/General: HUMS 250
 - 4. Literature: ENGL 184, 201 (Literature is required for all teacher education majors)
 - 5. Music: MUS 100, 123, 125 (A MUS course is required for Elementary Education majors)
 - 6. Philosophy: PHIL 112, 194, 212, 301
 - 7. Theatre: TH 125 (Required for English Education majors)
- E. Social and Behavioral Sciences (SB): Select one course from 2 different areas:**
 - 1. Anthropology (Cultural): ANTH 101
 - 2. Economics: ECON 201 (Required for Social Work majors)
 - 3. Geography (Human/Cultural): GEOG 101, 111 (Also meets a non-western history/culture requirement for teacher education students)
 - 4. History: HIST 101, 105, 140, 141, 150, 210, 211 (Any one also meets a western history/culture requirement for teacher education students)
 - 5. Political Science: POLS 101, 195, 251 (POLS 195 required for Social Work majors)
 - 6. Psychology: PSY 115 (Required for Social Work majors)
 - 7. Social Science/General: SSCI 104, CMTY 195, ECON 195, HIST 195, SOC 195, SW 195
 - 8. Sociology: SOC 160 (Required for Sociology and Social Work students)
- F. Sciences (S) and Sciences with Lab (SL): Select one course from two of the following areas, at least one with lab.** Students majoring in sciences, agricultural or environmental sciences areas may need more supporting sciences. Consult UWRF catalog or academic departments.
 - 1. Biology: BIOL 102, 151, 152 (BIOL 151 or 152 required for phy. ed., social work, most science, agricultural and envir sci majors. A biology course is also required for all teacher education students.)
 - 2. Chemistry: CHEM 101, 105, 140, 210 (CHEM 210 required for most science and all agriculture and envir sci majors)
 - 3. Geography (Physical): GEOG 273
 - 4. Geology/Earth Science: EAS 106, 109, 220, 235 (EAS 109 or 220 required for Geology or Conservation majors)
 - 5. Physics/Astronomy: ASTR 106, 107, PHYS 103, 231, 234 (PHYS 231 or 234 required for Ag. Engineering Tech. & Food Science majors)
- G. Mathematics (M):** Minimum Math requirements vary by major. Consult catalog or academic department.
 - 1. Select 1 from PSYC 201, or MATH 105 or higher, or STAT 193, 219, 229 (Statistics required for Psychology or Marketing Comm majors. MATH 112 or higher required for all College of Agric, Food & Envir Sci majors. MATH 211 or 221 required for Business or Accounting students. MATH 330 required for Elementary Ed majors.)
- H. Personal Health and Wellness (HW) and Health/Physical Activity (HA):** This includes a wellness/healthy lifestyle component (HW) and a physical activity (HA) component.
 - 1. Courses which meet the HW component only: HLTH 125 or 210 or 215 or PESS 122
 - 2. Courses which meet the HA component only: Any 1 credit PE activity course (PESS 115, 120, 123-130, 135-204, 210-213, 222-238, 270-290)
- I. Ethical Citizenship (EC):** Select one from BIOL 101, 105, COMM 220, SOWK 216

II. OTHER UNIVERSITY-WIDE REQUIREMENTS

- A. UW System Ethnic/Cultural Diversity Requirement** (One course) This is usually taken at UWRF, but courses such as ENGL 215, 216, ETHS 201, 205, 210, 215, HIST 106, 109, HURL 101, 102, 105, 201, 206, SOC 268, would fit in this category.
- B. UW-RF Global Perspectives Requirement** (One course) An advanced level course which examines subject matter from a global/international perspective. This is usually taken at UW-RF.
