Listed below are UW-Stevens Point (UW-STP) courses most directly applicable to UW-River Falls Gen Ed requirements. This is intended as a guide for program planning and is subject to revision if Gen Ed requirements or course evaluations change. Students may also check for Gen Ed and program updates in the on-line UWRF catalog at: www.uwrf.edu/catalog.

I. GENERAL EDUCATION

- A. Communication – Reading and Writing (CW):** ENGL 101
- B. Communication – Advanced (CA):** ENGL 102 or ENGL 150 (Completion of ENGL 150 meets GE CW&CA)
- C. Communication – Speaking and Listening (CS):** COMM 101
- D. Humanities and Fine Arts (HF): Select one course from two different areas.**
 - 1. Art: ART 181 (Required for Elementary Education majors)
 - 2. Film: COMM 160
 - 3. Literature: CLT 102, ENGL 200, 211, 212, 213, 214 (Literature is required for all teacher education majors)
 - 4. Music: MUS 100 or 101 or 220 (MUS 100 required for Elementary Education majors)
 - 5. Philosophy: PHIL 100, 101, 121, 230
 - 6. Theatre: THEA 105 (Required for English Education majors)
- E. Social and Behavioral Sciences (SB): Select one course from two different areas:**
 - 1. Anthropology: ANTH 101 or 110
 - 2. Economics: ECON 100 (Required for Social Work majors)
 - 3. Geography (Cultural): GEOG 113 or 120 (Also meets a non-western history/culture requirement for teacher ed)
 - 4. History: HIST 101, 102, 105, 106, 107, 108, 211, 212, 215, 216 (Also meets a western history/culture requirement for teacher education students)
 - 5. Political Science: POLI 101, 160, 180, 201 (POLI 201 required for Social Work majors)
 - 6. Psychology: PSYC 110 (Required for Social Work majors)
 - 7. Sociology: SOC 101 (Required for Sociology and Social Work students)
- F. Sciences (S) and Sciences with Lab (SL): Select one course from two of the following areas, at least one with lab.** All teacher education students need a biology course. Students majoring in sciences, agricultural or environmental sciences areas may need more supporting sciences. Consult UWRF catalog or academic departments.
 - 1. Biology: BIOL 101, 130, 160 (BIOL 101 required for Phy. Ed., Social Work, most science and agric sci majors)
 - 2. Chemistry: CHEM 100, 101, 105, 115 (CHEM105 or 115 required for most science and all ag and envir sci majors)
 - 3. Geography: GEOG 101
 - 4. Geology/Earth Sci: GEOL 100 or 104 (Required for Geology and Conservation majors)
 - 5. Physics/Astronomy: ASTR 100, 205, 206, 311, PHYS 101, 150, 201, 203 (PHYS 150 or 203 required for Agric Engineering Tech and Food Science majors)
- G. Mathematics (M):** Minimum Math requirements vary by major. Consult catalog or academic department.
 - 1. Select 1 from MATH 100 or higher, or PSYC 300. MATH 109 or 111 or 120 required for Business or Accounting majors. MATH 100 or 112 or 118 or 119 required for Coll of Agric, Food & Envir Sci majors. MATH 228 & 338 required for Elementary Ed majors. PSYC 300 required for Marketing Comm, Psychology and Social Work majors.
- H. Personal Health and Wellness (HW) and Health/Physical Activity (HA):** This includes a wellness/healthy lifestyle component (HW) and a physical activity (HA) component.
 - 1. Courses which meet both the HW and HA requirements: HP/W 102, 103, 106, 149, 201, FN 103
 - 2. Courses which meet the HW requirement only: WLNS 143, 144, 148, 151
 - 3. Courses which meet the HA requirement only: Select 1 credit from WLNS 100-121, 125-139, 152-204, 211-299
- I. Ethical Citizenship (EC):** Select one course from BIOL 100, COMM 190, ECON 272, GEOG 100, GEOL 330, NRES 150 or 151, PHIL 304

II. OTHER UNIVERSITY-WIDE REQUIREMENTS

These courses may double count in any area of the UWRF degree.

- A. UW System Ethnic/Cultural Diversity Requirement** (One course) Any UW-STP courses which are identified to satisfy the UW System Ethnic/Cultural Diversity requirement will satisfy this category.
- B. UWRF Global Perspectives Requirement** (One course) A course at an advanced level, which examines subject matter from a global/international perspective. This is usually taken at UWRF.

III. MAJOR/MINOR COURSES

Additional courses should be selected based on the intended subject area major/minor. Consult the UWRF web site (www.uwrf.edu) for links to academic departments, program requirements and the catalog.

GPA standards and enrollment limits may be placed on specific majors if needed to stay within program capacity. Consult the UWRF Admissions Office website for transfer admission standards. **Priority consideration** may be given to students who have completed the Communication (English Composition and Speech), Mathematics and Science requirements prior to transfer. **Transfer after one year is recommended** for teacher education, agriculture, and social work students.
