



## UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA-DULUTH

Listed below are University of Minnesota-Duluth courses most directly applicable to UW-River Falls Gen Ed requirements. This is intended as a guide for program planning and is subject to revision if Gen Ed requirements or course evaluations change. ### I. GENERAL EDUCATION

- A. Communication – Reading and Writing (CW):** COMP 1120
- B. Communication – Advanced (CA):** Select one from COMP 3100, 3110, 3121, 3130, 3140, 3160
- C. Communication – Speaking and Listening (CS):** COMM 1112 or FMIS 3141
- D. Humanities and Fine Arts (HF): Select one course from two different areas.**
  - 1. Art: ART 1001 or 1002 (Required for Elementary Education majors)
  - 2. Literature: ENGL 1101, 1575, 1582, 1907, 2571 (Literature is required for all teacher education majors)
  - 3. Film: TH 1051
  - 4. MUS 1001 (Required for Elementary Education majors)
  - 5. PHIL 1001, 1003
  - 6. TH 1001 (Required for English Education majors)
- E. Social and Behavioral Sciences (SB): Select one course from 2 different areas:**
  - 1. ANTH 1604
  - 2. ECON 1003 (Required for Social Work majors)
  - 3. GEOG 1202, 1304 (Also meets a non-western history/culture requirement for teacher education students)
  - 4. HIST 1207, 1208, 1304, 1305 (Any one also meets a western history/culture requirement for teacher education students)
  - 5. POL 1011, 1050, 1500 (POL 1011 required for Social Work majors)
  - 6. PSY 1003 (Required for Social Work majors)
  - 7. SOC 1101 (Required for Sociology and Social Work students)
- F. Sciences (S) and Sciences with Lab (SL): Select one course from two of the following areas, at least one with lab.** Students majoring in sciences, agricultural or environmental sciences areas may need more supporting sciences. Consult UW-RF catalog or academic departments.
  - 1. BIOL 1001, 1011 (BIOL 1011 required for phy. ed., social work, most science, and agricultural and environmental sciences majors. A biology course is also required for all teacher education students.)
  - 2. CHEM 1102, 1113, 1151, 1161 (CHEM 1151 or 1161 required for most science and all College of Agriculture, Food and Environmental Sciences majors)
  - 3. GEOG 1414
  - 4. Geology/Earth Science: GEOL 1110 or 2610 (GEOL 1110 required for Geology or Conservation majors)
  - 5. Physics/Astronomy: ASTR 1040, 1051, PHYS 1001, 1011, 2011 (PHYS 1001 or 2011 required for Ag. Engineering Tech. & Food Science majors)
- G. Mathematics (M):** Minimum Math requirements vary by major. Consult catalog or academic department.
  - 1. Select 1 from STAT 1411, PSY 3020, or MATH 1024 or higher (STAT 1411 or PSYC 3020 required for Psychology, Social Work or Marketing Communication majors. MATH 1005 or 1155 or 1250 required for all College of Agriculture, Food & Envir Sci majors. MATH 1290 or 1296 or 1596 required for Business or Accounting students. MATH 1141 required for Elementary Education majors.)
- H. Personal Health and Wellness (HW) and Health/Physical Activity (HA):** This includes a wellness/healthy lifestyle component (HW) and a physical activity (HA) component.
  - 1. Courses which meet the HW component only: HLTH 1100 or HLTH 1470
  - 2. Courses which meet the HA component only: Any 1 credit PE activity course (PE 1220 - 1927)
- I. Ethical Citizenship (EC):** Select one from COMM 2101 or GEOG 2306 or GEOL 1130 or FMIS 1601

### II. OTHER UNIVERSITY-WIDE REQUIREMENTS

- A. UW System Ethnic/Cultural Diversity Requirement** (One course) This is usually taken at UWRF, but courses such as AMIN 1120, AMIN 2105, AMIN 2115, EDUC 1100, SW 1619, would fit in this category.
- B. UW-RF Global Perspectives Requirement** (One course) An advanced level course which examines subject matter from a global/international perspective. This is usually taken at UWRF.
