



UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN – EAU CLAIRE

Listed below are UW-Eau Claire (UWEC) courses most directly applicable to UW-River Falls Gen Ed requirements. This is intended as a guide for program planning and is subject to revision if Gen Ed requirements or course evaluations change. Students may also check for updates to the Gen Ed and program requirements in the catalog: www.uwrf.edu/catalog.

I. GENERAL EDUCATION

- A. Communication – Reading and Writing (CW):** ENGL 110 (satisfies Communication Areas A and B)
- B. Communication – Advanced (CA):** ENGL 110 (satisfies Communication Areas A and B)
- C. Communication – Speaking and Listening (CS):** CJ 202
- D. Humanities and Fine Arts (HF): Select one course from two different areas.**
 - 1. Art: ART 105 (Required for Elementary Education majors)
 - 2. Dance: DNCE 101
 - 3. Film: ENGL 181
 - 4. Literature: ENGL 150, 230, 243, 244, 245 (Literature is required for all teacher education majors)
 - 5. Music: MUSCI 100, 102, 110 (MUSI 102 or 110 required for Elementary Education majors)
 - 6. Philosophy: PHIL 101, 120, 235
 - 7. Theatre: THEA 101 (Required for English Education majors)
- E. Social and Behavioral Sciences (SB): Select one course from 2 different areas:**
 - 1. Anthropology: ANTH 161
 - 2. Economics: ECON 100 (Required for Social Work majors)
 - 3. Geography (Cultural): GEOG 111 (Also meets a non-western history/culture requirement for teacher ed students)
 - 4. History: HIST 101, 102, 124, 125, 201, 202 (Any one also meets a western history/culture requirement for teacher education students); or HIST 152 (Also meets a non-western history/culture requirement for teacher ed students)
 - 5. Political Science: POLS 102, 110, 121, 122, 260 (POLS 110 required for Social Work majors)
 - 6. Psychology: PSYC 100 (Required for Social Work majors)
 - 7. Sociology: SOC 101 (Required for Sociology and Social Work students)
- F. Sciences (S) and Sciences with Lab (SL): Select one course from two of the following areas, at least one with lab.** All teacher education students need a biology course. Students majoring in sciences, agricultural or environmental sciences areas may need more supporting sciences. Consult UW-RF catalog or academic departments.
 - 1. Biology: BIOL 100, 110 (BIOL 110 required for Phy. Ed., Social Work, most science and agric sci majors)
 - 2. Chemistry: CHEM 100, 103, 115 (CHEM 103 or 115 required for most science and all agric and envir sci majors)
 - 3. Geography (Physical): GEOG 104
 - 4. Geology/Earth Sci: GEOL 102, 106, 110 (GEOL 106 or 110 required for Geology and Conservation majors)
 - 5. Physics/Astronomy: PHYS 100, 115, 211, 226, 229, 231 (PHYS 211 or 231 required for Agric Engineering Tech and Food Science majors)
- G. Mathematics (M):** Minimum Math requirements vary by major. Consult catalog or academic department.
 - 1. Select 1 from MATH 104 or higher. MATH 111 or 114 or 184 required for Business or Accounting students. MATH 109 or 112 or 113 required for Coll of Agriculture, Food & Envir Sci majors. MATH 203 & 204 required for Elem Educ.
- H. Personal Health and Wellness (HW) and Health/Physical Activity (HA):** This includes a wellness/healthy lifestyle component (HW) and a physical activity (HA) component.
 - 1. Courses which meet both the HW & HA requirements: KINS 186
 - 2. Courses which meet the HW requirement only: ADTN 265, 285, FMHN 211, 213, KINS 196, 262
 - 3. Courses which meet the HA requirement only: Select any 1 credit of activity from KINS 101 to 184.
- I. Ethical Citizenship (EC):** Select one course from BIOL 180, BIOL 195, CJ 105, FIN 135, GEOG 178, GEOL 115, PHIL 305, 320, SW 285.

II. OTHER UNIVERSITY-WIDE REQUIREMENTS

These courses may double count in any area of the UW-RF degree.

- A. UW System Ethnic/Cultural Diversity Requirement** (One course) Any UW-EC course or combination of courses which are identified to satisfy the UW System US Ethnic/Cultural Diversity requirement will satisfy this category.
- B. UW-RF Global Perspectives Requirement** (One course) A course at an advanced level, which examines subject matter from a global/international perspective. This is usually taken at UW-RF.

III. MAJOR/MINOR COURSES

Additional courses should be selected based on the intended subject area major/minor. Consult the UW-RF web site (www.uwrf.edu) for links to academic departments, program requirements and the catalog.

GPA standards and enrollment limits may be placed on specific majors if needed to stay within program capacity. Consult the UW-RF Admissions Office website for transfer admission standards. **Priority consideration** may be given to students who have completed the Communication (English Composition and Speech), Mathematics and Science requirements prior to transfer. **Transfer after one year is recommended** for teacher education, agriculture, and social work students.
