Listed below are UW-Green Bay courses most directly applicable to UW-River Falls Gen Ed requirements. This is intended as a guide for program planning and is subject to revision if Gen Ed requirements or course evaluations change. Students may also check for updates to the Gen Ed and program requirements in the UWRF catalog at: www.uwrf.edu/catalog.

I. GENERAL EDUCATION

- A. Communication – Reading and Writing (CW):** ENG COMP 100
- B. Communication – Advanced (CA):** ENG COMP 105
- C. Communication – Speaking and Listening (CS):** COMM 133 or COMM 280
- D. Humanities and Fine Arts (HF): Select one course from two different areas.**
 - 1. Art: ART 101 (Required for Elementary Education majors)
 - 2. Film: ENGLISH 101
 - 3. Literature: ENGLISH 104, 214, 215, 216, 217 (Literature is required for all teacher education majors)
 - 4. Music: COMN ART 121 (Required for Elementary Education majors)
 - 5. Philosophy: PHILOS 101, 102, 213
 - 6. Theatre: COMN ART 141 (Required for English Education majors)
 - 7. Humanities/General: HUM STD 101, 102, 201, 202
- E. Social and Behavioral Sciences (SB): Select one course from two different areas:**
 - 1. Anthropology: ANTHRO 100
 - 2. Economics: ECON 152 (Required for Social Work majors)
 - 3. Geography (Cultural): GEOG 102 or 202 (Also meets a non-western history/culture requirement for teacher ed students)
 - 4. History: HIST 100, 205, 206 (Any one also meets a western history/culture requirement for teacher education students); or HIST 250 (Also meets a non-western history/culture requirement for teacher education students)
 - 5. Political Science: POL SCI 100, 101 (POL SCI 101 required for Social Work majors)
 - 6. Psychology: PSYCH 102 (Required for Social Work majors)
 - 7. Sociology: SOCIOL 202 (Required for Sociology and Social Work students)
- F. Sciences (S) and Sciences with Lab (SL): Select one course from two of the following areas, at least one with lab.** All teacher education students need a biology course. Students majoring in sciences, agricultural or environmental sciences areas may need more supporting sciences. Consult UWRF catalog or academic departments.
 - 1. Biology: BIOL 202 (Required for Phy. Ed., Social Work, most science and agric sci majors)
 - 2. Chemistry: CHEM 108 or 211 (CHEM 211 required for most science and all agric and envir sci majors)
 - 3. Geology/Earth Sci: EARTH SC 102 or 202 (Required for Geology and Conservation majors)
 - 4. Physics/Astronomy: ENV SCI 141, 142, PHYSICS 103, 141, 180, 201 (PHYSICS 103 or 201 required for Agric Engineering Tech and Food Science majors)
- G. Mathematics (M):** Minimum Math requirements vary by major. Consult catalog or academic department.
 - 1. Select 1 from MATH 101 or higher. MATH 201 or 202 required for Business or Accounting students. MATH 101 or 104 required for College of Agric, Food & Envir Sci majors. MATH 281 & 282 required for Elementary Ed majors.
- H. Personal Health and Wellness (HW) and Health/Physical Activity (HA):** This includes a wellness/healthy lifestyle component (HW) and a physical activity (HA) component.
 - 1. Courses which meet the HW requirement only: NUT SCI 242
 - 2. Courses which meet the HA requirement only: Select any 1 credit from PHY ED 121 to 148
- I. Ethical Citizenship (EC):** Select one course from: BUSADM 282, COMM 102, ENV SCI 102, PU EN AF 102

II. OTHER UNIVERSITY-WIDE REQUIREMENTS

These courses may double count in any area of the UW-RF degree.

- A. UW System Ethnic/Cultural Diversity Requirement** (One course) Any courses which are identified to satisfy the UW System Ethnic/Cultural Diversity requirement will satisfy this category.
- B. UW-RF Global Perspectives Requirement** (One course) A course at an advanced level, which examines subject matter from a global/international perspective. This is usually taken at UWRF.

III. MAJOR/MINOR COURSES

Additional courses should be selected based on the intended subject area major/minor. Consult the UWRF web site (www.uwrf.edu) for links to academic departments, program requirements and the catalog.

GPA standards and enrollment limits may be placed on specific majors if needed to stay within program capacity. Consult the UWRF Admissions Office website for transfer admission standards. **Priority consideration** may be given to students who have completed the Communication, Mathematics and Science requirements prior to transfer. **Transfer after one year is recommended** for teacher education, agriculture, and social work students.
