Listed below are UW-La Crosse (UW-LAC) courses most directly applicable to UW-River Falls Gen Ed requirements. This is intended as a guide for program planning and is subject to revision if Gen Ed requirements or course evaluations change. Students may also check for updates to the Gen Ed and program requirements in the catalog at:

I. GENERAL EDUCATION

A. Communication – Reading and Writing (CW): ENG 110

B. Communication – Advanced (CA): Satisfied by ENG 110 with grade of BC or better. If grade below BC in ENG 110, select one from ENG 303, 304, 305, 306, 307, 308, 309.

C. Communication – Speaking and Listening (CS): CST 110

D. Humanities and Fine Arts (HF): Select one course from two different areas.

1. Art: ART 102 (Required for Elementary Education majors)
2. Dance: ESS 104
3. Literature: ENG 200, 201, 202, 203, 204, 205, 206, 207, 208 (Literature is required for all teacher educ majors)
4. Music: MUS 105 or 110 (Required for Elementary Education majors)
5. Philosophy: PHL 100, 201, 205
6. Theatre: THA 110 (Required for English Education majors)

E. Social and Behavioral Sciences (SB): Select one course from two different areas:

1. Anthropology: ANT 101
2. Economics: MGT 100 (Required for Social Work majors)
3. Geography (Cultural): GEO 110 (Also meets a non-western history/culture requirement for teacher ed students)
4. History: HIS 101, 102, 202, 204, 206, 210, 220, 230, 240 (Any one also counts as a western history/culture course for teacher ed students); or 250 (also counts as a non-western history/culture requirements for teacher ed students)
5. Political Science: POL 101, 202, 234 (POL 101 required for Social Work and teacher education majors)
6. Psychology: PSY 100 (Required for Social Work majors)
7. Sociology: SOC 110 (Required for Sociology and Social Work students)

F. Sciences (S) and Sciences with Lab (SL): Select one course from two of the following areas, at least one with lab. All teacher education students need a biology course. Students majoring in sciences, agricultural or environmental sciences areas may need more supporting sciences. Consult UW-RF catalog or academic departments.

1. Biology: BIO 102, 103, 105 (BIO 105 required for Phy. Ed., Social Work, most science and agric sci majors)
2. Chemistry: CHM 100, 103 (CHM 103 required for most science and all agric and envir sci majors)
3. Geology/Earth Sci: ESC 101 (Required for Geology and Conservation majors)
4. Physics/Astronomy: PHY 103, 106, 125, 155, 156, 203 (PHY 103 or 203 required for Agric Engineering Tech and Food Science majors)

G. Mathematics (M): Minimum Math requirements vary by major. Consult catalog or academic department.

1. Select 1 from MTH 125 or higher. MTH 175 or 207 required for Business or Accounting students. MTH 150 or 151 required for College of Agriculture, Food & Envir Sci majors. MTH 125 & 171 required for Elementary Ed majors.

H. Personal Health and Wellness (HW) and Health/Physical Activity (HA): This includes a wellness/healthy lifestyle component (HW) and a physical activity (HA) component.

1. Courses which meet both the HW and HA requirements: HPR 105, ESS 117
2. Courses which meet the HW requirement only: HED 101, 205, 230
3. Courses which meet the HA requirement only: Select any 1 credit of ESS 100 Physical Activities or ESS 113

I. Ethical Citizenship (EC): Select one course from CST 170, ENV 201, FIN 207, GEO 200

II. OTHER UNIVERSITY-WIDE REQUIREMENTS

These courses may double count in any area of the UW-RF degree.

A. UW System Ethnic/Cultural Diversity Requirement (One course) Any UW-LAC courses which are identified to satisfy the UW System Ethnic/Cultural Diversity requirement will satisfy this category.

B. UW-RF Global Perspectives Requirement (One course) A course at an advanced level, which examines subject matter from a global/international perspective. Select from HIS 205, 250, MUS 201, PHL 220, POL 202, 234

III. MAJOR/MINOR COURSES

Additional courses should be selected based on the intended subject area major/minor. Consult the UW-RF web site (www.uwrf.edu) for links to academic departments, program requirements and the catalog.

GPA standards and enrollment limits may be placed on specific majors if needed to stay within program capacity. Consult the UW-RF Admissions Office website for transfer admission standards. **Priority consideration** may be given to students who have completed the Communication (English Composition and Speech), Mathematics and Science requirements prior to transfer. **Transfer after one year is recommended** for teacher education, agriculture, and social work students.
