Listed below are Waldorf College courses most directly applicable to the UW-River Falls General Education requirements. This is intended as a guide for program planning and is subject to revision if program requirements or course evaluations change. Students may check for updates to the General Education and program requirements in the on-line UW-RF

catalog at: www.uwrf.edu/catalog.

I. GENERAL EDUCATION

- A. Communication – Reading and Writing (CW):** ENG 101 or 104 or 106
- B. Communication – Advanced (CA):** ENG 102 or 105 or 107
- C. Communication – Speaking and Listening (CS):** SPE 111 or BUS 330
- D. Humanities and Fine Arts (HF): Select one course from two different areas.**
 - 1. Humanities, General: HUM 120, 301, 302
 - 2. Literature: ENG 207 or 208 or 212 (Literature is required for all teacher education majors)
 - 3. Philosophy: PHL 111 or 271 or 272 or 300
 - 4. Theatre: THR 131 (Required for English Education majors)
- E. Social and Behavioral Sciences (SB): Select one course from 2 different areas:**
 - 1. Geography (Cultural): GEO 201 (Also meets a non-western history/culture requirement for teacher ed students)
 - 2. History: HIS 110, 120, 160, 171, 201, 202, 203, 365 (Also meets a western history/culture requirement for teacher education students)
 - 3. Political Science: POL 111 or 112 or 330 (PS 112 required for Social Work majors)
 - 4. Psychology: PSY 111 or 120 (Required for Social Work majors)
 - 5. Sociology: SOC 221 (Required for Sociology and Social Work students)
- F. Sciences (S) and Sciences with Lab (SL): Select one course from two of the following areas, at least one with lab.** All teacher education students need a biology course. Students majoring in sciences, agricultural or environmental sciences areas may need more supporting sciences. Consult UW-RF catalog or academic departments.
 - 1. Biology: BIO 105, 120 (BIO 120 required for phy. ed., social work, most science, agricultural and enviro sci majors)
 - 2. Chemistry: CHM 121 or 131 (CHM 131 required for most science majors and all agriculture majors)
 - 3. Physics/Astronomy: PHY 151, 221, 231 (PHYS 221 or 231 required for Ag Engr Tech & Food Sci majors)
- G. Mathematics (M):** Minimum Math requirements vary by major. Consult catalog or academic department.
 - 1. Select 1 from MTH 101 or higher. (MTH 103 required for agriculture majors. MTH 203 required for Business or Accounting majors.)
- H. Personal Health and Wellness (HW) and Health/Physical Activity (HA):** This includes a wellness/healthy lifestyle component (HW) and a physical activity (HA) component.
 - 1. Courses which meet the HW component: Select 1 from WEL 101 or PED/WEL 221
 - 2. Courses which meet the HA component: Select 2 from PED 102 – 120 or PED 001 - 011
- I. Ethical Citizenship (EC):** Select one course from BIO 125 or COM 121

II. OTHER UNIVERSITY-WIDE REQUIREMENTS

These courses may double count in any area of the UW-RF degree.

- A. UW System Ethnic/Cultural Diversity Requirement** (One course) A course which examines U.S. ethnic/cultural diversity. This is generally taken at UW-RF.
- B. UW-RF Global Perspectives Requirement** (One course) A course at an advanced level, which examines subject matter from a global/international perspective. This is usually taken at UW-RF.

III. MAJOR/MINOR COURSES

Additional courses should be selected based on the intended subject area major/minor. Consult the UW-RF web site (www.uwrf.edu) for links to academic departments, program requirements and the catalog.

GPA standards and enrollment limits may be placed on specific majors if needed to stay within program capacity. Consult the UW-RF Admissions Office website for transfer admission standards. **Priority consideration** may be given to students who have completed the Communication (English Composition and Speech), Mathematics and Science requirements prior to transfer. **Transfer after one year is recommended** for teacher education, agriculture, and social work students.
