Listed below are Winona State University courses most directly applicable to UW-River Falls Gen Ed requirements. This is intended as a guide for program planning and is subject to revision if degree requirements or course evaluations change. I. GENERAL EDUCATION

- A. Communication – Reading and Writing (CW):** ENG 111
- B. Communication – Advanced (CA):** ENG 210
- C. Communication – Speaking and Listening (CS):** CMST 191 or 266
- D. Humanities and Fine Arts (HF): Select one course from two different areas.**
 - 1. Art: ART 109 or 110 (ART 109 required for Elementary Education majors)
 - 2. Dance: THAD 115
 - 3. Film: HUM 140
 - 4. English Literature: ENGL 120, 220, 221 (Literature is required for all teacher education majors)
 - 5. Music: MUS 109 or 114 (MUS 109 required for Elementary Education majors)
 - 6. Philosophy: PHIL 110, 120, 130, 201, 230
 - 7. Theatre: THAD 111 (Required for English Education majors)
- E. Social and Behavioral Sciences (SB): Select one course from 2 different areas:**
 - 1. GEOG 110, 213 (Also meets a non-western history/culture requirement for teacher education students)
 - 2. HIST 120, 121, 122, 150, 151 (any one also meets a western history/culture requirement for teacher education students), or HIST 123 (also meets a non-western history/culture requirement for teacher education students)
 - 3. POLS 120, 130, 135 (POLS 120 required for Social Work majors)
 - 4. PSYC 210 (Required for Social Work majors)
 - 5. SOC 150 (Required for Sociology and Social Work students)
- F. Sciences (S) and Sciences with Lab (SL): Select one course from two of the following areas, at least one with lab.** Students majoring in sciences, agricultural or environmental sciences areas may need more supporting sciences. Consult UW-RF catalog or academic departments.
 - 1. Biology: BIOL 118, 241, 242 (BIOL 241 or 242 required for phy. ed., social work, most science, agricultural and enviro sci majors. A biology course is also required for all teacher education students.)
 - 2. Chemistry: CHEM 100, 106, 107, 108, 210, 212 (CHEM 212 required for most science majors and all agriculture and environmental science majors)
 - 3. Geography (Physical): GEOG 212
 - 4. Geology/Earth Sci: GEOS 120, 121, 110, 111 (GEOS 120 or 121 required for Geology or Conservation majors)
 - 5. Physics/Astronomy: PHYS 115, 201, 221, GEOS 105, 106 (PHYS 201 or 221 required for Ag. Engineering Tech. & Food Science majors)
- G. Mathematics (M):** Minimum Math requirements vary by major. Consult catalog or academic department.
 - 1. Select 1 from MATH 100 or higher, or STAT 110 or 210, or PSY 231. (STAT 110 or 210 or PSY 231 required for Psychology or Marketing Comm majors. MATH 120 or higher required for all College of Agriculture, Food & Envir Sci majors. MATH 140 or 160 required for Business or Accounting students. MTED 125 AND 201 required for Elementary Ed majors.)
- H. Personal Health and Wellness (HW) and Health/Physical Activity (HA):** This includes a wellness/healthy lifestyle component (HW) and a physical activity (HA) component.
 - 1. Courses which satisfy both the HW and HA requirements: PER 199
 - 2. Courses which meet the HW component only: HERS 204 or 205
 - 3. Courses which meet the HA component only: Any 1 credit PE activity course (PER 100 - 144)
- I. Ethical Citizenship (EC):** Select one course from BIOL 104, BUED 215, GEOS 102, MCOM 100, SOWK 340

II. OTHER UNIVERSITY-WIDE REQUIREMENTS

- A. UW System Ethnic/Cultural Diversity Requirement** (One course) This is usually taken at UW-RF, but courses such as ENG 220, HIST 220, HIST 235, or SOC 423 would fit in this category.
- B. UW-RF Global Perspectives Requirement** (One course) An advanced level course which examines subject matter from a global/international perspective. This is usually taken at UW-RF, but GEOG 223, HIST 123, or HIST 165 would fit in this category.

III. MAJOR/MINOR COURSES Additional courses should be selected based on the intended subject area major/minor. Consult the UW-RF web site (www.uwrf.edu) for links to academic departments, program requirements and the catalog.
