I. GENERAL EDUCATION

Listed below are UW Colleges courses most directly applicable to Gen Ed requirements for students completing degrees in the UWRF College of Agriculture, Food & Environmental Sciences (CAFES). This is intended as a guide for program planning and is subject to revision if requirements or course evaluations change. A. Communication:

1. ENG 101 AND 102

B. Humanities and Fine Arts: Select 1 course from 2 different areas.

1. Art: ART 100, 175, 180, 181, 183
2. Film: COM 150, ENG 277
3. Literature: ENG 250, 260, 261, 262, 263, 264, 265, 266, 267, 268, 269, 270, 272, 273, 274, 276
4. Music: MUS 170, 173, 174, 275, 276
5. Philosophy: PHI 101, 241, 253
6. Theatre: COM 130

C. Social & Behavioral Sciences: Select 1 course from 2 different areas.

1. ANT 100, 104
2. ECO 101
3. GEO 101, 110
4. HIS 101, 102, 105, 106, 161, 162
5. POL 101, 104, 160, 175
6. PSY 201, 202
7. SOC 101

D. Sciences: Select 1 course from 2 different following areas. At least 1 course must have a laboratory. Some CAFES majors require more than the minimum science requirements. Consult the catalog or CAFES website (above) for info.

1. BIO 109 or BOT 130 or ZOO 101 (Required for most CAFES majors)
2. CHE 145 (Required for all CAFES majors)
3. GLG 100 or 101 (Required for some CAFES majors)
4. PHY 141 or 201 (Required for some CAFES majors)

E. Mathematics: Select 1 course.

1. MAT 110 or a higher level college algebra/trig or precalculus or calculus course (MAT 113 or 124 or 211 or 221)

F. Personal Health & Wellness:

Take PED 127; OR take PED 206 AND 1 credit of activities from PED 001-061 or 101-118.

G. Ethical Citizenship: Select 1 course from BUS 110, 242, COM 201, BIO 103, BIO 107, BOT 240, GEO 130, 350, GLG 135, 169, PHI 243, 244

Priority consideration may be given to applicants who have completed the Communications Skills, Mathematics, and Science areas prior to transfer.

Students who complete the Associate of Arts & Sciences Degree are considered to have satisfied UWRF Gen Ed requirements, except for a junior/senior level "Multidisciplinary Inquiry" course, which must be taken at UWRF. Some majors may require specific Gen Ed courses which are prerequisites in the major or are required for professional licensure. Consult the UWRF catalog or the major department for information.

II. OTHER UNIVERSITY-WIDE REQUIREMENTS These courses may "double count" in any area of the UWRF degree.

A. UW System Ethnic/Cultural Diversity Requirement. Students may satisfy the UW System Ethnic/Cultural Diversity requirement by taking any UW Colleges course identified to meet this requirement.

B. UWRF Global Perspectives Requirement. Students must have one course at the sophomore level or higher which examines subject matter from a global/international perspective.

III. MAJOR/MINOR Students should select courses based on the intended major/minor areas. Some majors may recommend or require specific Gen Ed courses, which may also satisfy prerequisite or supporting course requirements for the major. Consult the UWRF catalog (www.uwrf.edu/catalog) or the CAFES website (www.uwrf.edu/cafes) for links to major departments.

Students planning to complete TEACHER EDUCATION degrees should see UWRF course selection guide for the College of Education & Professional Studies. Transfer after one year is generally recommended for teacher education students.

Students planning to complete degrees in LIBERAL ARTS areas should see the UWRF course selection guide for the College of Arts & Sciences.

Students planning to complete BUSINESS, ACCOUNTING or COMPUTER SCIENCE/INFORMATION SYSTEMS degrees should see the UWRF course selection guide for the College of Business and Economics.
