The Games

-The Falcons play two more WIAC games this week. On Wednesday the Falcons travel to UW-La Crosse. On Saturday the Falcons finally return to Karges Center when they host UW-Stevens Point. It will be the first home game for the Falcons since Jan. 7 - a span of three games.

-UWRF played well in two road WIAC games last week. The win at Stout was the team's second road win of the season and the first in WIAC play. The Falcons also played well in a 55-49 loss at Oshkosh, the team that was picked to win the 2006 WIAC title. After another road game on Wednesday the Falcons play at home for the first time in three games on Saturday. UWRF is 74-94 against La Crosse and 39-93 against Stevens Point all-time. Hans Hoeg is third in scoring in the WIAC (16.7).

-UWL may be the surprise team in the WIAC this year. The Eagles are 13-3 overall and 4-3 in the WIAC. UWL finished 7-18 overall and 4-12 in the WIAC in 2005. Joe Werner leads the Eagles in scoring averaging 13.9 points per game. He is second in the WIAC in rebounding (7.8).

-UWSP hasn't missed a beat after winning two straight NCAA Div. III National Championships. The Pointers are tied for first place (with Whitewater) in the WIAC with a 6-1 record. Jon Krull is second in the WIAC in scoring (17.3) and Brian Bauer is fourth (15.7). Krull leads UWSP in rebounding (5.8). UWSP leads the WIAC in scoring offense (75.3).

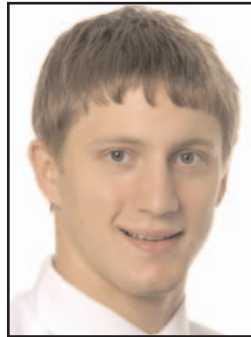
River Falls - Previous Week Recap

At Stout on Wednesday Hans Hoeg led the Falcons with 26 points and Ryan Zylstra added 14 in the team's 66-57 win. Eric Kossoris scored 13 points. Zylstra led the Falcons with nine rebounds. UWRF shot 20-47 (.426) from the field compared to Stout's 21-61 (.344). The Falcons made nine three-pointers (9-18) and limited Stout to just 1-13 shooting from behind the arc.

At Oshkosh on Saturday the Falcons played another solid game and came within seconds of beating the Titans, who were picked to win the WIAC title in the pre-season poll. Hoeg again led the Falcons with 15 points. Zylstra scored 10 points. Alex Maas, who scored four points, lead the team with seven rebounds. UWRF was 13-42 from the floor, but only 1-15 from behind the arc.

Head Coach - Rick Bowen

Rick Bowen begins his 20th season as the UW-River Falls basketball coach in 2005-06.

He will be the first to admit that his lengthy tenure surprises him as much as anybody. "I originally came here thinking I would stay a maximum of five years and move on, but the University and the community have been so good to me that it has just turned into 20 years.

"This is a very special place. I am allowed to teach and coach. I am allowed to live a life doing what I love to do. The University administration has its priorities in order. I have really come to respect basketball at the Div. III level. To have the opportunity to coach basketball at the highest of levels in the WIAC and UW-River Falls is a privilege."

Bowen currently is seventh all time in the WIAC win column. His 259 victories at UW-River Falls put him first all-time in Falcon victories. Combining his head high school and collegiate wins, Bowen is approaching the 400 win total for his career.

The 2003-04 season will go down in history as the season that ended 54 years of Falcon basketball frustration. The Falcons hit the 20-win mark for the first time since the 1950 season and brought the elusive WIAC championship home to Karges Center, the campus and the city of River Falls. He was named the WIAC basketball Coach of the Year award and his peers also selected him as the NABC West Region Coach of the Year.

This was not the only national recognition Bowen and the Falcons received. The NABC named 6-8 Rich Melzer as the Div. III National Player of the Year and a first team All-American for the second consecutive year. Melzer is now playing professionally for a team in New Zealand in the Australian professional league.

Success has not come easy for Bowen and UW-River Falls. The 2005-06 season begins the 94th season of collegiate basketball for the Falcons. The University sports an overall 883-927 record for a .490 win/loss percentage. Bowen is currently 259-234. Since the turn of the new century the Falcons have been 89-52 finishing 1st, 3rd, 3rd, 4th and 5th in the nation's most competitive basketball conference.

The seven consecutive winning seasons from 1989 to 1996 was a stretch that was last equaled in the 1915-22 Falcon basketball seasons. Bowen's Falcons made school history for the 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th time by landing a spot in the NAIA District 14 playoffs in 1987, 1990, 1991 and 1992.

"I know we have struggled at times. I make no excuses. We are what we are. We play in Karges Center, a sub-par facility. We lack the historical perspective of some of our competitors. I have enjoyed taking the kids that want to come to River Falls to get a good education, and play basketball, and make us competitive. We have been consistently good, and I am very proud of that."

In the 2004-05 academic year Bowen's responsibilities increased as he was named the permanent UWRF Athletic Director, He is the only coach in the WIAC doing double duty serving as a coach and Director of Athletics.

Bowen came to UW-RF in 1986 following five years as a Wisconsin Badger assistant coach where he served on the staff with current Badger Coach Bo Ryan. He previously was an assistant coach at Ball State University, working under Coach Steve Yoder at both institutions.

Bowen graduated from Indiana University with an undergraduate degree in physical education in 1966. He served the Hoosiers as a student-manager under two time National Champion Coach Branch McCracken. Like his father, son Matthew was a basketball manager at Indiana University under Coach Bob Knight. Basketball runs deep in the Bowen family. Grandfather Vernie Bowen was an Indiana High School coach for 40 years. Nephew Christopher is currently the basketball manager at the United States Military Academy under Coach Jim Crews. Nephew Andrew Bowen is currently the basketball manager at Bethel College in Mishawaka, Indiana.

Bowen began his career in Indiana teaching government and coaching basketball. He earned a Masters degree from St. Francis in 1971. He served in the United States Army as a combat medic from 1967-69 with service in Vietnam from December of 1967 to December of 1968. For his actions in Vietnam he was awarded a Bronze Star.



Rick and his wife Sandy met as students while at Indiana University. They have been married for 39 years and have two sons. Sandy is retired after teaching cell biology and botany at River Falls High School. Matthew is assistant basketball coach at Valparaiso University and married to Birmingham, Ala., native Ashli. They have a daughter, McKenzi, 3, and reside in Valparaiso, Ind.



Mike and his wife Pam, a UWRP graduate in marketing communications and former Falcon tennis player from Monticello, Minn., own and operate Bowen's Garage on Main Street in River Falls. Pam also works in the Graduate and Outreach department at the University. Mike is a graduate of Dakota County Technical School.

UW-River Falls vs. UW-La Crosse -- Last Meeting

River Falls 69, La Crosse 62

The Falcons came off last weekends bye with a 69-62 win over La Crosse (6-16, 3-10) at the Karges Center on Wednesday night. With the win River Falls (7-14, 3-10) moves into a three way tie with UWL and UW-Superior for the final two WIAC Tournament playoff spots.

It was a back and forth game that was tied up at 26 at the half and involved four ties and six lead changes. The Falcons outscored La Crosse 43-36 in the second half thanks 57.9 (11-19) shooting overall and 50.0 (4-8) shooting from three point land.

Overall for the game River Falls shot 22-49 (44.9) from the field, 8-18 (44.4) from beyond the arc and 17-23 (73.9) from the free throw line. La Crosse was 24-60 (40.0) overall, 7-19 (36.8) from three and 7-14 (50.0) from the charity stripe. UWL out rebounded the Falcons 39-33 and 16-9 on the offensive glass. Joe Werner led with a game high 15 rebounds, 10 coming in the first half.

The Eagles outscored RF in the paint, 26-20; had more second chance points, 14-6, but were outscored on the bench 30-2 by River Falls. The Falcons won the turnover battle 10-12 and utilized the turnovers by converting them into 15 points while UWL only scored 10 points off of turnovers. River Falls had the games only four fast break points.

Individually junior guard Hans Hoeg led RF with 18 points and six rebounds while senior forward Jeff Holt put in 16 and sophomore guard Eric Kossoris finished scoring 12. Junior center Muris Lucarevic finished with a game high four blocks to go with seven points off the bench. Freshman center Ryan Zylstra came off the bench to contribute eight points and five rebounds.

Marcus Conigliaro led all Eagles with 21 points while three other La Crosse players finished in double figures. Chris Fehrenbach scored 14, Werner added 12 and Timothy Owen finished with 10 points. Josh Hall dished out a game high four assists to go with a game high four turnovers.

UW-River Falls vs. Stevens Point -- Last Meeting

Stevens Point 94, River Falls 66

The Falcon men's basketball team dropped a 94-66 WIAC game at UW-Stevens Point Wednesday night.

UWSP held a 42-37 lead at the half and outscored the Falcons, 52-29, in the second half. With the win the Pointers won their fifth WIAC title in the past six seasons. UWRP dropped into a tie for seventh place with Superior and La Crosse.

Hans Hoeg led the Falcons with 12 points. Ryan Zylstra, Muris Lucarevic, Jeff Holt and Eric Kossoris all scored eight points. Kossoris led the Falcons with five rebounds. Scott Kelly, Mitch Coffman and Dan Torrez all had three rebounds. Kossoris led UWRP with three assists. The Falcons shot 22-51 (.431) from the field, including 9-24 (.375) from three-point range. UWRP was 13-16 (.713) from the line.

UWSP had five players score in double figures led by Jason Kalsow who finished with 27. He scored 16 second half point in helping UWSP to a season high 94 points. Tamaris Relerford scored a career-high 16 points. Kalsow and Jon Krull had seven rebounds each. UWSP shot 36-57 (.632) from the field, including 13-24 (.542) from behind the arc. They were 9-12 (.750) from the line.
