The Games

- UW-River Falls plays two more home WIAC games this week. On Wednesday the Falcons host UW-La Crosse at 7 p.m., and on Saturday the Falcons host UW-Stevens Point at 3 p.m. Both games will be played at the Karges Center.

-UWRF will try to snap a two game losing streak. The Falcons have not lost three games in a row in 2005-06. Post player Traci Reimann is fifth in scoring (15.0) and second in rebounding (10.1) in the WIAC. Point guard Melanie Preiner is 11th in scoring in the WIAC (12.3) and she leads the WIAC in steals (50).UWRF is second in the WIAC in turnover margin (+3.31). The Falcons are 29-20 against La Crosse and 21-35 against Stevens Point all-time. The Falcons have split with UWLC the past two seasons with the home team winning each game. UWRF beat UWSP twice last year, making up for the 2004-05 season when UWSP won three games (including a 90-57 decision at Stevens Point in the league playoffs).

-UWLC may be the surprise team in the WIAC in 2006. The Eagles trail WIAC leader, Oshkosh, by just one game. Already this year UWLC has won more games overall and in the WIAC than in 2004-05 when they finished 11-15 overall and 4-12 in the WIAC. The Eagles have only one player who averages in double figures in scoring, but have six players who average at least nine points per contest. Nicole Palmer is the leader with a 10.3 average. Ashley Fall leads the team averaging 6.4 rebounds a game. The Eagles lead the WIAC in scoring margin (+12.6) and turnover margin (+4.62).

-UW-SP had a five game winning streak snapped on Saturday with a 67-63 loss at UW-Eau Claire. The Pointers are a perfect 6-0 at home, but only 3-5 on the road. UWSP leads the WIAC in scoring offense (76.8) and rebounding margin (+9.5) and is third in scoring margin (+11.4). Cassandra Schultz is seventh in the WIAC in scoring (13.7). Nathalie Lechault leads the team in rebounding (6.3). Lechault leads the WIAC in field goal shooting (76-116, .655) and blocks (52). She has led the Pointers in scoring in four of the team's last five games averaging 17 points per game in that span. UWSP has lost three WIAC games by seven (Oshkosh 69-62), seven (La Crosse 62-55) and four (67-63 Eau Claire) points.

Head Coach - Cindy Hovet

Cindy Hovet enters her sixth year as the head basketball coach at UW-River Falls with the 2005-06 season.

Hovet was inducted into the UW-Stout Athletic Hall of Fame in November. She is the only person who has been named a WIAC Coach of the Year (2001) and named a WIAC Player of the Year (1994).

The 2004-05 Falcons had another fine season finishing 17-8 overall and 10-6 and in fourth place in the highly competitive WIAC. The 17 wins and 10 WIAC victories were the second most by a Hovet coached team. She needs just six wins to reach 75 in her career. She has coached five players who have received All-WIAC honors; including Erin Effle who was the 2005 WIAC women's basketball Scholar-Athlete.

The 2003-04 season concluded with a 13-13 overall record, and 4-12 in the WIAC. Although the team didn't do as well in conference play as they had hoped, they managed to put together a perfect 9-0 non-conference record. That perfect record included impressive victories against two NCAA national tournament qualifiers, Lakeland College (22-6) and Maryville University (23-3). Both Lakeland and Maryville went undefeated and were champions of their respective conferences, which again highlights the strength and parity in the WIAC where the Falcons finished seventh in 2003-04.

The Falcons will take on another strong schedule in 2005-06. Besides facing each of the WIAC teams twice, the Falcons have nine non-conference games. The Falcons will play at St. Thomas on Nov. 27. The Tommies have won more MIAC titles (10) than any other institution. The Falcons also play a road game at NCAA Div. II Winona State (Dec. 11). In all the Falcons play six games against teams that were either ranked or earned votes in the D3hoops.com preseason Top 25 poll.

The two years prior to last season, the Falcons have finished in sixth place in the WIAC with a 10-15 overall record in 2002-03 and 11-15 in 2001-02. Hovet's first season at the helm for UWRF was the program's most successful since 1988-89. With an 18-8 overall record, they tied for third place in the conference. Hovet was named the WIAC Coach of the Year for the team's accomplishments that season.

Hovet was the UWRF head tennis coach and assistant basketball coach for five years before taking over the basketball program in 2000-01. Her playing career was also in the WIAC. As a student-athlete at UW-Stout she was a two-time All-WIAC first team selection in 1993 and 1994. Her senior season she was named the 1994 WIAC Player of the Year and earned All-American honors. She was named to the second All-WIAC team in 1992. She helped the Blue Devils to a 76-27 record and berths in both the NCAA Division III and NAIA National Tournaments for four seasons.

Hovet received her Psychology undergraduate degree and Coaching minor from UW-Stout. She completed here Master's Degree in Kinesiology with an emphasis in Sport Psychology and Sociology at the University of Minnesota. She currently teaches at UWRF in the health & human performance department along with her coaching duties.

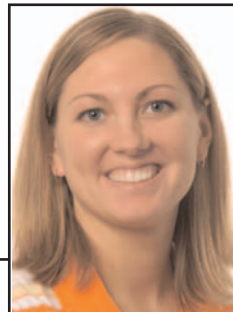
Last Week's Results

The Falcons lost a 71-59 WIAC game at the Karges Center to UW-Stout on Wednesday. The Falcons jumped to a 13-7 lead with 15:52 to play in the first half, but Stout 15-0 run to take a 22-13 lead with 9:22 to play and never looked back. Stout led 45-29 at the half. UWRF was led by Traci Reimann who scored 27 points. Melanie Preiner added 10 points. Reimann also led the Falcons with eight rebounds. Reimann finished on top in the battle between two of the top big players in the WIAC. Stout's Kelsey Douss scored 16 points and grabbed five rebounds. She led the Blue Devils in scoring. UWRF shot 23-51 (.451) from the floor and 9-12 (.750) from the line while Stout finished 26-68 (.382) from the floor and 12-13 (.923) from the line.

On Saturday the Falcons played a solid game at UW-Oshkosh, but the Titans prevailed in the end, 75-72. The Falcons were led by Miranda Biteler who scored a career high 26 points. She was 9-15 from the field, including 7-9 from three-point range. She was 1-2 at the line and had seven rebounds. The seven three-pointers made is the second most by a Falcon in a single game. Reimann scored 14 points and led all players with 16 rebounds. She had 16 rebounds once earlier this year and that is her season high. The Falcons shot 25-60 from the field (.477), including 11-24 (.458) from three-point range. They were 11-16 (.688) from the line. The Falcons had a 44-31 advantage in rebounds. UW O was led by Brittany Herrick who scored 24 points and she had nine rebounds. The Titans were 24-58 (.474) from the field, including 8-24 (.333) from three-point range. They were a near perfect 19-20 (.950) from the line.

The Falcons put together a near perfect game in crushing La Crosse, 84-41, Tuesday night at the Karges Center. The 84 points is a season high and the 41 points allowed is also a season best.

The Falcons held a 39-19 lead at the half and went on to outscore the Eagles, 35-22 in the second half.

Four Falcons scored in double figures led by Traci Reimann who had 18. She was 7-9 from the field. Erin Effle finished with 17 points, Chantele Melgaard 13 and Megan Lindman 12. The Falcons shot 33-64 (.515) from the floor, including 10-21 (.476) from three-point range. The 33 field goals is a season high. The Falcons were 8-12 (.667) from the line. Effle led all rebounders with 10 while Melgaard and Gina Astedt each had six. The Falcons led by as many as 22 in the first half, the last, 39-17, with 1:13 to play. The Falcons led by double digits throughout the second half with the final 43 point differential the largest of the second half.

Lindsay Wahl led UWL with nine points. Shawna Koss scored eight. Wahl also led the Eagles with four rebounds. UWL shot 15-46 (.326) from the line, including just 1-10 (.100) from three-point range. They were 10-18 (.556) from the line. The Falcons held a 43-25 advantage in rebounds.

Erin Effle scored a career high 29 points to help lead the Falcon women's basketball team to a 75-68 win at UW-Stevens Point on Tuesday night.

UWSP was in sole possession of first place in the WIAC going into the game with an 11-3 WIAC record. But with the Falcon win, the Pointers are now tied with Oshkosh and Stout for first place. UWRF is in fourth place.

Effle finished 11-18 from the field and 7-9 from the line for 29 points. She had six rebounds, three blocks and one assist. Krista Cordes came off the bench to scored 13 points and Chantele Melgaard added 11. Megan Lindman, who scored seven points, led the Falcons with eight rebounds. UWRF shot 25-48 (.521) from the field - it was the second best shooting night of the season for the Falcons. They were 4-9 (.444) from three-point range and 21-32 (.656) from the line.

The Falcons limited UWSP's leading scorer, Amanda Nechuta, to just 11 points. She entered the game leading the WIAC in scoring averaging 17 points a game. Cassandra Schultz led the Pointers with 20 points. Amy Scott was the game high rebounder with 13. UWSP held a 42-36 advantage in rebounds. UWSP shot 22-65 (.338) from the field, including 2-18 (.111) from behind the arc. They were 22-33 (.667) from the line.
