The Game

* The Falcons travel to Washington for their second game of the 2006 season. UW-RF will face Pacific Lutheran on Saturday with kick off set for 1:30 p.m. (PT).

* Both teams opened their season last weekend with losses. The Falcons lost a 41-9 decision at St. John's and PLU lost at home to Cal Lutheran, 17-14.

* This is the third meeting in a row between the two teams. The Falcons traveled to Washington in 2004 and the Lutes took a 28-24 win at Sparks Stadium. PLU played at Ramer Field in 2005 and the Falcons won that game, 45-14.

* Falcon Coach John O'Grady, in his 18th season with the Falcons, has a 92-76-3 career record. He is 1-1 against PLU. He is a 1979 graduate of UW-RF and is third among active WIAC coaches in wins. He needs three wins to get to No. 7 in all-time wins in the WIAC.

* After Saturday's game at PLU, the Falcons travel to Ft. Wayne, Ind., to face St. Francis on Sept. 23. Game time is set for noon.

River Falls - St. John's Recap

The Falcons football team fell to St. John's 41-9 Saturday afternoon at Clemens Stadium.

The Johnnies opened the game up quickly scoring on their first possession. Mike Patnode scored on a six-yard run, which

capped off an eight play 88-yard drive. Midway through the first quarter the Falcon defense stepped up and scored a touchdown on Jamie Bisch's 39-yard interception return to make the score 7-6 after a missed Spasimir Bodurski extra point. The score after the first quarter was St. John's leading 7-6.

St. John's scored quickly in the second quarter after a botched punt attempt. Patnode scored on the next play this time from six-yards out to make the score 13-6 after a missed extra point. On RF's next possession Jeremy Wolff threw a pass that was intercepted by John Cloeter and returned to the 34-yard line. The Johnnies scored three plays later on a Alex Kofoed pass to Mike Lofboom from four yards out to cap off a three play 34-yard drive to make the score 20-6 SJU. Shane Hanson recovered a Mike Lofboom fumbled punt return with 18 seconds left in the first half. Bodurski's 25-yard field goal with one second left in the half capped off a three play seven-yard drive to make the score SJU leading 20-9 at recess.

In the third quarter, the Johnnies continued to pour it on with a 26-yard Kofoed to Kyle Gearman touchdown pass. The drive was six plays and covered 71 yards. With only 1:49 left in the third quarter the Johnnies scored again on another Kofoed pass this time to Patnode for 58 yards. It capped off a five play, 80-yard drive. The score after the third quarter was SJU dominating 34-9.

The Johnnies scored the only points of the fourth quarter on an eight-yard Kofoed run to make the score 41-9 SJU. It capped off an 11 play 56-yard drive with 4:40 taken off the clock. That ended the scoring.

Nathan Anderson led the way for the Falcons with 111 yards on the ground. Wolff passed for 59 yards on 5-13 throwing with one interception. Andy Marx had two catches for 23 yards. Andy Kolstad led the way with 15 total tackles with four solo. Hanson had six total tackles with five solo. Tony Dorner and Nathan Renk combined for a sack.

SJU was led by Kofoed's 14-19 passing for 265 yards and three touchdowns. He also had one rushing touchdown. Patnode ran for 66 yards and two touchdowns on 16 carries. He caught three passes for 82 yards and one touchdown.

Legendary SJU coach John Gagliardi picked up his 434th career win and his 410th at St. John's.

Pacific Lutheran - Cal Lutheran Recap

Connor Pearce kicked a 38-yard field goal with 2:15 left in the game to cap a California Lutheran rally as the Kingsmen defeated Pacific Lutheran, 17-14, in the 2006 football season opener for both teams on Saturday at Sparks Stadium

The Kingsmen won their second consecutive season opener against Pacific Lutheran after defeating the Lutes, 42-35, to start the 2005 campaign.

Pacific Lutheran held a 14-7 lead entering the fourth period when an interception by Tim Stevens, one of three Cal Lutheran picks during the game, set up the Kingsmen on their own 41-yard line. On the ensuing play, Danny Jones lofted a screen pass to Louis Montano in the left flat, and he used excellent blocking to race untouched down the left sideline for a 59-yard score. The extra point by Pearce brought the score even at 14-14.

Cal Lutheran forced a PLU punt on the following possession, and the Kingsmen started what proved to be the game-winning drive from their 40-yard line. They converted a fourth-and-one from their 49-yard line when Jones faked a handoff and found Sean Coen for a 7-yard gain. After another first down and facing fourth down at the PLU 22-yard line, the Kingsmen went with Pearce, and his kick put the visitors from Thousand Oaks, Calif., ahead for the first time.

On PLU's next play, Chris Maine threw his third interception, this one grabbed by Chase King, and the Kingsmen ran out the clock.

The Lutes took an early 7-0 lead, turning a Cal Lutheran fumble into a 34-yard scoring drive. Maine completed an 8-yard touchdown pass to Craig Chiado to complete seven-play drive.

Cal Lutheran tied the score later in the first period after Jason Spratt's interception set his team up at the PLU 27-yard line. Montano had rushes of nine and four yards, leading to a 14-yard scoring aerial from Jones to Danny Hernandez.

The Lutes regained the lead in the second period when Maine capped a 15-play, 76-yard drive with a 1-yard touchdown plunge.

At the halftime break, the Lutes had out-gained the Kingsmen, 151 yards to 120. The Cal Lutheran defense proved stingy in the second half, limiting the Lutes to 74 yards of offense in the final 30 minutes.

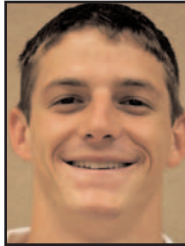
Cal Lutheran, meanwhile, finished with 299 total yards. Jones completed 14-of-25 passes for 234 yards with two touchdowns and one interception. Montano led all rushers with 74 yards on 20 carries. Coen had three catches for 82 yards for Cal Lutheran. For the Lutes, Maine was 18-of-29 for 157 yards with one touchdown and the three interceptions. Chiado had eight catches for 67 yards, and Anthony Canger was the leading ground gainer with 49 yards on 14 carries.

Scott Westering

Scott Westering has compiled a 9-9 overall record in two seasons as Pacific Lutheran University football head coach. Named to the position in February 2004, Scott took over for his father, Frosty, who served as PLU football head coach for 32 years.



He joined the coaching staff in 1981 and became the offensive coordinator two years later. During his coaching career, PLU has won two NAIA Division II and one NCAA Division III national championships and finished as the runner-up four times in 10 post-season appearances. He has coached 11 first-team All-Americans, including the 1999 NCAA Division III Player of the Year, Chad Johnson, and the Most Valuable Player of the 1999 national championship team, Anthony Hicks.

Westering played football at UCLA for one year before transferring to PLU, where he was a captain and All-America tight end on the 1980 NAIA national title team. Westering later had tryouts with the Buffalo Bills and San Francisco 49ers. He was inducted into the PLU Hall of Fame in 1998.

He earned his bachelor's degree in 1982 and his master's degree in 2002, both from PLU. He is also a physical education instructor at PLU.

Westering and his wife, Susan, an aerobics instructor at PLU, are the parents of three children, daughters Jordan and Jessi and son Kellen. The Westerings live in Puyallup.

UW-RF At Ramer Field

The Falcons are 27-23 at Ramer Field since 1995. The Falcons last winning season at Ramer Field was in 2000, when they went 3-1. In conference play, the Falcons are 22-15 at Ramer Field since 1995, with their last winning season in 2001, when they finished 2-1. The Falcons last undefeated season at Ramer Field was in 1998, when they went 5-0 overall and 4-0 in conference play.

UW-RF On The Road

The Falcons are 26-33 on the road since 1995. The Falcons last winning season on the road was in 2000, when they went 3-2 overall and 3-1 in conference play. The Falcons are 21-19 on the road in conference play since 1995. In 1999 and 2000 the Falcons finished with 3-1 records on the road in conference play.

UW-RF At Neutral Sites

The Falcons are 4-1 at neutral sites since 1995. They have not played a neutral site game since 2000, when they lost to Bemidji State at the Metrodome, 23-20.

UW-RF Football History

The first year of Falcon football was in 1895 when the team finished with a 2-0 record after playing and beating New Richmond High School twice. The first game against a collegiate team was in 1899 when the Falcons lost to Superior, 12-0. It wasn't until 1923 when the Falcons started playing only collegiate teams. UW-RF has won 18 WIAC titles, third most of all WIAC institutions. The Falcons have a 472-309-49 record in 103 seasons.

Head Coach John O'Grady

John O'Grady is in his 18th year as head coach at UW-RF and stands second in all-time football wins.

Under O'Grady the Falcons have compiled an 92-76-3 overall record, a winning percentage of .550. Among WIAC active coaches he is third in wins and is eighth in all-time wins. He needs just three wins to reach the seventh spot. In WIAC play O'Grady has led the Falcons to one first place finish (1998), three second place finishes (1994, 1995, 1996) and five third place finishes (1989, 1992, 1999, 2000, 2001). He has had winning seasons in 10 of his 17 seasons with the Falcons.



Year-in and year-out the Falcons are one of the top teams in the WIAC under the veteran coach. In 1998, the Falcons surprised most WIAC observers. The team finished 7-3 overall and

5-2 in the WIAC good for a tie for first place. In 1996 the team finished 9-2 overall and lost to La Crosse (44-0) in the first round of the playoffs. In 1995 the Falcons were 9-3 overall. The nine wins tied the school record. In the playoffs the Falcons beat Central, Iowa, (10-7) but then lost to La Crosse (28-14). In 1999 the Falcons were 6-4 and 5-2 (third place) in the WIAC.

Last year UW-RF was 3-7 overall and 2-5 in the WIAC. They placed seventh. In 2004 the Falcons finished a disappointing 3-7 overall and 3-4 (fifth place tie) in the WIAC. In 2003 the Falcons were 2-7 overall and 2-5 (sixth place) in league play. In 2002 UWRF was 3-7 overall and 2-5 in WIAC play (sixth place). The Falcons finished 4-5 overall and 4-3 (tie third place) in the WIAC in 2001. In 2000, the Falcons were 6-4 overall and 5-2 (third place) in the WIAC.

O'Grady was named the 1995 WIAC Coach of the Year. His teams have compiled a 61-50-3 record in WIAC play. O'Grady combines his vast football knowledge and intensity to help the Falcons succeed.

O'Grady, 53, played for the Falcons (linebacker) from 1972-75 and earned four letters. He was the team captain and voted most dedicated in 1975 when the Falcons won their first WIAC title in 18 years.

He coached for two years at Miami University of Ohio as an offensive line coach and offensive special teams coordinator. Before that, he coached at the University of Wisconsin-Madison (1985-86) as an offensive line coach and special teams coordinator, at Kent State University, Ohio, where he was offensive coordinator/offensive line and offensive special teams coordinator (1983-84), and at the University of Wisconsin as a part time assistant coach of tight ends and special teams (1981-82). He also was an assistant at UW-River Falls (1976-80) as a linebacker, secondary and special teams coach.

O'Grady played football at Sullivan High School, Chicago, Ill., from 1968-71 and was team captain, most valuable player and winner of a coach's award as a senior. He is a native of Worcester, Mass.

He earned his undergraduate degree in physical education from UW-River Falls in 1979 and his master's degree in supervision and instructional leadership from UW-RF in 1983. Besides coaching football, O'Grady teaches classes in the University's health and human performance department.

O'Grady is a firm believer in education and helps all UW-RF students in pursuit of collegiate degrees. In his career as head coach, 166 of 167 Falcon football players, who have completed four seasons of eligibility, have earned undergraduate degrees. Several have gone on to highly successful careers in education, coaching, business.

He runs three summer football camps - Wishbone, Kickers and Big O & D. About 400 participants and 75 coaches, many of them are UW-RF graduates, attend the camps each summer. The Kickers Camp has been a mainstay at UW-RF for 33 years and has had top NFL and college kickers attend as counselors. Gary Zauner, special teams coach of the Arizona Cardinals, has been a counselor for 29 years.

O'Grady is well known as a speaker and clinician throughout the midwest. He has spoken at the Wisconsin Football Coaches Association spring clinic several times and has addressed participants at the Indiana Wishbone Coaches Association clinic. He has been invited to give clinics in Wisconsin, Illinois, Pennsylvania, Indiana and Minnesota. For the past 15 years he has worked with former Falcon football player and teammate, Darryl Herrick, at a football clinic in Gilman, Wis. The clinic was established by Herrick, who is the superintendent of the Cedarburg school district, in memory of a nephew who was killed in a hunting accident.

He and wife, Jody, have three children: Lindsey, 25, Jaclyn, 22 and Logan 19. Lindsey, a UW-RF graduate, teaches social studies and coaches volleyball and track & field at the Mauston middle school. Jaclyn graduated from the University of Minnesota in 2005 with a degree in film studies. She plans on going to graduate school. Logan will be a sophomore at the University of St. Thomas this fall and competes in cross country and track & field.

Last Season

UW-RF 45, PLU 14

The Falcon football team picked up its first win of the season, 45-14, over Pacific Lutheran at Ramer Field Saturday afternoon.

RF scored the first points of the game on their second possession. Zeke Secrist capped off a seven play 70-yard drive with a five-yard touchdown run at 8:42. The Falcons led after the first quarter, 7-0.

The Falcons scored the next points of the game on ball control. The Falcons drove 86 yards in 14 plays which was capped off by a 22-yard Dan Keller field goal. On PLU's next possession they took the ball all the way to the RF 15 where Tony Dorner forced a Adam Fallert fumble which was recovered by Matt Jordan. The Falcons took no time in scoring off the turnover. Jeremy Wolff ran 80-yards for a RF touchdown to make the score 17-0 RF at 5:02.

PLU got on the board later in the second quarter going 80 yards in eight plays which was capped off by Matt Steiner's three-yard touchdown run. RF scored the last points of the first half on Ryan Hansen's eight-yard touchdown catch from halfback Andy Kolstad. Kolstad took a pitch and on the halfback option hit Hansen in the end zone. The drive covered 64 yards in seven plays. RF led at the half, 24-7.
